- AN ACT TO AMEND THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE
 RELATING TO THE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY MANAGER TO AWARD
 AND EXECUTE CERTAIN CONTRACTS.
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. Section 9.82 of the Charter of the City of Charlotte, being Chapter 7 713, Session Laws of 1965, as amended by Chapters 133 and 333, Session Laws of 8 1969 and Chapter 481, Session Laws of 1973, rewritten by Chapter 391, Session Laws 9 of 1979, and amended by Chapter 1140, Session Laws of 1981 and Chapter 343, 10 Session Laws of 1985, reads as rewritten:

"Sec. 9.82. Award and approval of certain contracts. The city manager or his duly 11 authorized designee is hereby authorized to award, approve, and execute contracts or 12 agreements of any kind or nature on behalf of the city when the amount of such contract 13 or agreement does not exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) fifty thousand dollars 14 (\$50,000); provided that the city council shall have approved a sufficient appropriation 15 in the annual budget for the current fiscal year for the general purpose specified in the 16 contract or agreement. In addition, the City Manager or his duly authorized designee is 17 authorized to approve and execute amendments to contracts or agreements, including 18 contracts initially approved by the City Council, when the amount in question does not 19 exceed thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000). fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000). Furthermore, 20 21 the City Manager or his duly authorized designee is authorized to award, approve, and execute contracts for the construction and installation of water and sewer lines that will 22 eventually become a part of the City utility system, regardless of the amount, where the 23

- 1 construction and installation is the sole responsibility and is at the sole expense of
- 2 another person, firm, or corporation."
- 3 Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
