A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR REIMBURSEMENT OF STATE EMPLOYEE 3 LUNCHES.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 138-6(a) reads as rewritten:

Travel on official business by the officers and employees of State 6 "(a) departments, institutions and agencies which operate from funds deposited with the 7 State Treasurer shall be reimbursed at the following rates: 8

- For transportation by privately owned automobile, twenty-five cents 9 (1)(25¢) per mile of travel and the actual cost of tolls paid. No 10 reimbursement shall be made for the use of a personal car in 11 commuting from an employee's home to his duty station in connection 12 with regularly scheduled work hours. Any designation of an 13 employee's home as his duty station by a department head shall require 14 prior approval by the Office of State Budget and Management on an 15 annual basis. 16 17
 - For bus, railroad, Pullman, or other conveyance, actual fare. (2)
- (3) For expenses incurred for subsistence, payment of fifty-five dollars 18 (\$55.00) per day when traveling in-state or sixty-seven dollars 19 (\$67.00) per day when traveling out-of-state. When travel involves less 20 than a full day (24-hour period), a reasonable prorated amount shall be 21 paid in accordance with regulations and criteria which shall be 22 promulgated and published by the Director of the Budget. 23

18		<u>d.</u>	When the lunch is included as an integral part of a congress,
19			conference, assembly, or convocation, by whatever name
20			called. Such assembly must involve the active participation of
21			persons other than the employees of a single State department,
22			institution, or agency; the employee's attendance must be
23			necessary for the performance of his duties but must not be part
24			of that employee's normal day-to-day business activities; or the
25			assembly must be planned in advance with a formal agenda, and
26			include a written notice or invitation to participants.
