G.S. 138-6(a) reads as rewritten: on official business by the officers and employees of State stitutions and agencies which operate from funds deposited with the hall be reimbursed at the following rates: For transportation by privately owned automobile, twenty-five cents (25¢) per mile of travel and the actual cost of tolls paid. No reimbursement shall be made for the use of a personal car in commuting from an employee's home to his duty station in connection with regularly scheduled work hours. Any designation of an employee's home as his duty station by a department head shall require prior approval by the Office of State Budget and Management on an annual basis. For bus, railroad, Pullman, or other conveyance, actual fare. For expenses incurred for subsistence, payment of fifty-two dollars (\$52.00) per day when traveling in-state or sixty-four dollars (\$64.00) per day when traveling out-of-state. employees for lunches eaten while on official business may be made 1 2 only in the following circumstances: 3 When an overnight stay is required reimbursement is allowed while an employee is in travel status; 4 5 When the cost of the lunch is included as part of a registration b. 6 fee for a formal congress, conference, assembly, or 7 convocation, by whatever name called. Such assembly must 8 involve the active participation of persons other than the 9 employees of a single State department, institution, or agency 10 and must be necessary for conducting official State business; When the State employee is a member of a State board, 11 c. 12 commission, committee, or council which operates from funds deposited with the State Treasurer, or when the State 13 14 employee's job requires his attendance at the meeting of such 15 board, commission, committee, or council in his official 16 capacity, and the lunch is preplanned as part of the meeting for 17 the entire board, commission, committee, or council; or 18 d. When the lunch is included as an integral part of a congress, conference, assembly, or convocation, by whatever name 19 20 called. Such assembly must involve the active participation of 21 persons other than the employees of a single State department, institution, or agency; agency, the employee's attendance must 22 23 be necessary for the performance of his duties but must not be 24 part of that employee's normal day-to-day business activities; and activities, or the assembly must be planned in advance with 25 a formal agenda, and include a written notice or invitation to 26 27 participants.
