(c) <u>Defense</u>. It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution for ethnic intimidation under G.S. 14-32.2(a)(3) that the defendant spoke or acted only in a critical, insulting,

- (d) Civil Liability. A person who is subjected to acts of ethnic intimidation may institute a civil action for injunctive relief, damages, or both. A person who commits the crime of ethnic intimidation shall be liable in a civil action for actual damages resulting from the crime, reasonable attorney's fees, and, in the discretion of the court, punitive damages."
- Sec. 2. This act shall become effective October 1, 1989, and shall apply to acts committed on or after that date.
