AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE FOR A SURVEY OF DENTAL RISK MANAGEMENT PROGRAMS, AND TO MODIFY PER DIEM AND OFFICER SALARY AUTHORIZATION FOR THE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS.

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Insurance \$1,525 for the 1989-90 fiscal year for the purpose of funding a survey of North Carolina dental facilities' risk management programs.

Sec. 2. G.S. 90-43 reads as rewritten:

"§ 90-43. Compensation and expenses of Board.

Notwithstanding G.S. 93B-5(a), Each each member of the North Carolina State Board of Dental Examiners shall receive as compensation for his services in the performance of his duties under this Article a sum not exceeding the amount provided in G.S. 93B-5(a) one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each day actually engaged in the performance of the duties of his office, said per diem to be fixed by said Board, and all legitimate and necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the said Board.

All per diem allowances and all expenses paid as herein provided shall be paid upon voucher drawn by the secretary-treasurer of the Board who shall likewise draw voucher payable to himself for the salary fixed for him by the Board.

The Board is authorized and empowered to expend from funds collected hereunder such additional sum or sums as it may determine necessary in the administration and enforcement of this Article, and employ such personnel as it may deem requisite to

- 1 assist in carrying out the administrative functions required by this Article and by the
- 2 Board."
- Sec. 3. Section 1 of this act shall become effective July 1, 1989. Section 2 of
- 4 this act is effective upon ratification.
