A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO PAMLICO COUNTY TO EXPAND THE
COUNTY WATER SYSTEM.

Whereas, the Pamlico County water system currently serves 4,005 customers; and

Whereas, this is an increase of 2,205 customers since the system first came on line in 1980 which is a one hundred and twenty-two percent (122%) increase in a period of approximately eight years and a nine percent (9%)in increase in the past year; and

Whereas, Pamlico County needs another treatment plant, two elevated storage tanks and an additional water main to interconnect the system to service properly the existing users; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to Pamlico County the sum of \$250,000 for the 1989-90 fiscal year to construct a new treatment plant to be located in the Kenshaw area, two 300,000 gallon elevated storage tanks and an additional water main to interconnect the system. This appropriation shall be matched with non-State funds on the basis of two dollars (\$2.00) of non-State funds for every one dollar (\$1.00) of State funds. The market value of any property and services provided by a non-State entity or an individual shall be considered as non-State funds.

Sec. 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
