A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR NURSING EDUCATION AND 3 TRAINING PROGRAMS.
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. Recruitment. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the 6 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred 7 thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of one hundred 8 thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education 9 Centers for use in developing more varied clinical training sites for nursing students. 10 These funds shall be allocated among the schools of nursing within the community 11 colleges and the constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina.

12 (b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 13 The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 14 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1990-91 15 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers to provide information and training 16 programs which help retain new nursing graduates for employers of nurses.

17 (c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 18 The University of North Carolina the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) 19 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for 20 the 1990-91 fiscal year, to provide materials and training about health careers for 21 middle-school career exploration teachers.

22 (d) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 23 Community Colleges the sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for the 1989-90

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fiscal year, and the sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used to enhance formula funding to the nursing programs. All institutions receiving this funding shall, at a minimum, fund their nursing programs at this enhanced level. Any increases in regular curriculum per student funding shall also provide proportional increases in nursing programs.

6 (e) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina 7 Foundation for Nursing, Inc., the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for 8 the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 9 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for covering the costs of promoting nursing as a 10 profession. These funds may not become a part of the continuation budget.

(f) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 11 12 The University of North Carolina, the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) 13 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, to be used for awarding competitive grants to the schools of 14 nursing of The University of North Carolina and of the community colleges for 15 innovative efforts to recruit various groups of students into the nursing schools. The 16 Board of Governors shall create an advisory group composed of the Deans of the 17 schools of nursing from The University of North Carolina and the community college 18 system, selected administrators and officers of The University of North Carolina and the 19 community college system, and representatives of the nursing profession. The advisory 20 group shall set criteria for grant awards and shall make recommendations for the 21 selection of grant recipients based on grant applications received. Each grant recipient 22 shall submit an evaluation of its efforts to the Legislative Commission on Nursing, the 23 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, and the Department of 24 Community Colleges.

(g) There is appropriated from the General Fund to The University of North Carolina Board of Governors, the sum of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars (\$125,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used to continue and to expand its pilot efforts in nursing recruitment.

30 (h) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors 31 of The University of North Carolina the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for 32 the 1990-91 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers Program for the purpose 33 34 of increasing the availability of refresher courses for nurses. The Area Health 35 Education Centers Program may use the funds as incentives to nursing schools which provide courses to nurses who are subsequently relicensed by the North Carolina Board 36 37 of Nursing or who reenter the practice of nursing.

Sec. 2. Retention. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for the awarding of competitive grants to employers of nurses for developing innovative pilot efforts to retain nurses in patient care. The Board of Governors shall create an advisory group composed of representatives of the following: the North Carolina Hospital Association, the North

Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the North Carolina Association for Home 1 2 Care, private industry, and the nursing profession. The advisory group shall set criteria 3 for the solicitation of grant proposals and for the award of grant funds, and shall make recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications 4 5 received. All grants shall require that an evaluation of each grant recipient's efforts be 6 conducted and submitted to the Legislative Commission on Nursing within three years 7 of receipt of grant funds, and that the results of the evaluation be made available for 8 publication. Funds which are unspent at the end of the fiscal year may not revert to the 9 General Fund but shall remain available for the purposes stated herein.

10 (b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 11 The University of North Carolina the sum of two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars 12 (\$225,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of three hundred thirty-five 13 thousand dollars (\$335,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used to continue and to 14 expand pilot efforts to retain nurses in the nursing profession.

15 (c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Commission 16 on Nursing the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal 17 year, to be used to plan for a Center for Excellence in Nursing. The Legislative 18 Commission on Nursing may contract with other groups for this planning effort. In 19 contracting with other groups for the planning effort, the Legislative Commission on 20 Nursing shall comply with the provisions of G.S. 120-32.02.

21 (d) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 22 The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) 23 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers Program to conduct 24 two pilot institute programs for nurses involved in direct patient care. The Director of 25 the Area Health Education Centers Program shall provide an evaluation of the pilot institutes to the Legislative Commission on Nursing not later than May 1, 1990. The 26 27 evaluation shall include the institutes' effect on retaining nurses in the nursing profession. 28

29 Sec. 3. Education. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of 30 Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of two hundred forty thousand dollars (\$240,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of four hundred thousand 31 dollars (\$400,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers 32 Program to use for targeting recruitment efforts for nursing schools, for improvement of 33 on-campus nursing programs for working registered nurses, and for the expansion of 34 35 off-campus nursing degree programs. The Area Health Education Centers Program shall report on the use of these funds to the General Assembly and the Legislative 36 37 Commission on Nursing not later than March 1, 1990.

38 (b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 39 The University of North Carolina the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars 40 (\$250,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of two hundred fifty thousand 41 dollars (\$250,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for funding need-based 42 scholarship loans for nursing students. Of the funds appropriated to the Board of 43 Governors, twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) shall be allocated for each fiscal year to 44 the State Education Assistance Authority for allocation to private colleges in North Carolina which have nursing programs. These funds shall be administered in accordance
 with Article 9C of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

(c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Board of
Community Colleges the sum of seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) for the
1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) for
the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for funding need-based scholarship loans for nursing
students. These funds shall be administered in accordance with the provisions of Article
9C of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

9 Sec. 4. Salary. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of 10 Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) 11 12 for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for funding demonstration grants for employers 13 of nurses. The demonstration grants shall be competitive and shall be designed to 14 experiment with salary programs for nurses within professional practice models. These 15 funds may not be used to pay nursing salaries. The Board of Governors shall create an 16 advisory group composed of representatives of the following: the North Carolina 17 Hospital Association, the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the North Carolina Association for Home Care, private industry, and the nursing profession. The 18 19 advisory group shall set criteria for grant awards, and shall make recommendations for 20 the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications received. Grant criteria shall 21 include the requirement that there be an evaluation and reporting of the results of the 22 grant project to the Legislative Commission on Nursing, the Board of Governors of The 23 University of North Carolina, the North Carolina Hospital Association, and the North 24 Carolina Health Care Facilities Association.

25 (b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the 26 27 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the 1990-91 28 fiscal year, to be used to fund demonstration grants for employers of nurses. The grants 29 shall be competitive and shall be designed to stimulate innovative approaches to 30 providing child care and flexible fringe benefit plans for nurses. These funds may not 31 be used to pay nursing salaries. The Board of Governors shall create an advisory group composed of representatives of the following: the North Carolina Hospital Association, 32 the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the North Carolina Association 33 34 for Home Care, private industry, and the nursing profession. The advisory group shall 35 set criteria for the award of grants and shall make recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications received. Grant criteria shall include the 36 37 requirement that there be an evaluation and reporting of the results of the grant project 38 to the Legislative Commission on Nursing, the Board of Governors of The University of 39 North Carolina, the North Carolina Hospital Association, and the North Carolina Health 40 Care Facilities Association.

(c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of
The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000)
for the 1989-90 fiscal year, to be used to provide competitive demonstration grants to
health care facilities for the improvement of nursing support services and productivity

efforts, which may include computerization efforts. The Board of Governors shall 1 2 create an advisory group, the membership of which shall include representatives of the 3 following: the North Carolina Hospital Association, the North Carolina Health Facilities 4 Association, the North Carolina Association for Home Care, private industry, and the 5 nursing profession. The advisory group shall set criteria for the award of grants, 6 including the potential for the proposed project's replication at other facilities, and shall 7 make recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications 8 received. Awards criteria shall include the requirement that an evaluation report on the 9 results of the project be conducted and submitted to the Legislative Commission on 10 Nursing, the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, and other entities designated by the Board of Governors. Funds which are unspent at the end of each 11 12 fiscal year may not revert to the General Fund but shall remain available for the 13 purposes designated herein.

14 (d)There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 15 The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 16 1989-90 fiscal year to be used for incentive planning grants for the development of 17 integrated pay, career advancement, and education plans for nurses. The Board of 18 Governors shall create an advisory group composed of representatives of the following: 19 the North Carolina Hospital Association, the North Carolina Health Care Facilities 20 Association, the North Carolina Association for Home Care, private industry, and the 21 nursing profession. The advisory group shall set criteria for grant awards and shall make 22 recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications 23 received. Grant awards shall be designed to stimulate plans which are applicable to 24 various types and sizes of health care institutions, and shall require that evaluations of 25 the project be conducted and reported to the Legislative Commission on Nursing and other entities designated by the Board of Governors. 26

27 Sec. 5. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General 28 Assembly the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal 29 year to be used for the operations of the Legislative Commission on Nursing.

(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of
The University of North Carolina the sum of one million six hundred thousand dollars
(\$1,600,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year to provide scholarships under the Nursing
Scholars Program established in G.S. 90-171.61 and administered by the State
Educational Assistance Authority.

(c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of
The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000)
for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for
the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used to enable the State Education Assistance Authority to
provide staff and administrative support in carrying out the provisions of Article 9C of
Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

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Sec. 6. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.

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
