## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO REQUIRE GENERAL CONTRACTORS TO PROVIDE EVIDENCE OF
- 3 FINANCIAL RESPONSIBILITY AND TO INCREASE THE PROJECT VALUE
- LIMITS FOR THE LIMITED LICENSE. 4
- 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 6
  - Section 1. G.S. 87-10 reads as rewritten:

#### 7 "§ 87-10. Application for license; examination; certificate; renewal.

8 Anyone seeking to be licensed as a general contractor in this State shall file an 9 application for an examination on a form provided by the Board, at least 30 days before any regular or special meeting of the Board accompanied by an examination fee of 10 twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) and by the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) if the 11 application is for an unlimited license, the sum of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) if the 12 application is for an intermediate license or the sum of fifty dollars (\$50.00) if the 13 application is for a limited license; the fees and sum accompanying any application 14 shall be nonrefundable. The holder of an unlimited license shall be entitled to act as 15 general contractor without restriction as to value of any single project; the holder of an 16 intermediate license shall be entitled to act as general contractor for any single project 17 with a value of up to five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000); the holder of a limited 18 license shall be entitled to act as general contractor for any single project with a value of 19 up to one hundred seventy-five thousand dollars (\$175,000) two hundred fifty thousand 20 21 dollars (\$250,000); and the license certificate shall be classified in accordance with this section. Before being entitled to an examination an applicant must show to the 22 satisfaction of the Board from the application and proofs furnished that the applicant is 23

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possessed of a good character and is otherwise qualified as to competency, ability and 1 integrity, ability, integrity, and financial responsibility, and that the applicant has not 2 3 committed or done any act, which, if committed or done by any licensed contractor would be grounds under the provisions hereinafter set forth for the suspension or 4 5 revocation of contractor's license, or that the applicant has not committed or done any act involving dishonesty, fraud, or deceit, or that the applicant has never been refused a 6 7 license as a general contractor nor had such license revoked, either in this State or in 8 another state, for reasons that should preclude the granting of the license applied for, 9 and that the applicant has never been convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude, 10 relating to building or contracting, or involving embezzlement or misappropriation of funds or property entrusted to the applicant: Provided, no applicant shall be refused the 11 12 right to an examination, except in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 150A-150B 13 of the General Statutes.

14 The Board shall conduct an examination, either oral or written, of all applicants for 15 license to ascertain the ability of the applicant to make a practical application of his 16 knowledge of the profession of contracting, under the classification contained in the 17 application, and to ascertain the qualifications of the applicant in reading plans and 18 specifications, knowledge of estimating costs, construction, ethics and other similar matters pertaining to the contracting business and knowledge of the applicant as to the 19 20 responsibilities of a contractor to the public and of the requirements of the laws of the 21 State of North Carolina relating to contractors, construction and liens. If the results of 22 the examination of the applicant shall be satisfactory to the Board, then the Board shall 23 issue to the applicant a certificate to engage as a general contractor in the State of North 24 Carolina, as provided in said certificate, which may be limited into five classifications 25 as the common use of the terms are known – that is,

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- Building contractor, which shall include private, public, commercial, industrial and residential buildings of all types;
- (1a) Residential contractor, which shall include any general contractor constructing only residences which are required to conform to the North Carolina Uniform Residential Building Code (Vol. 1-B);
- (2) Highway contractor;
- 32 (3) Public utilities contractors, which shall include those whose operations
  33 are the performance of construction work on the following
  34 subclassifications of facilities:
  35 a. Water and sewer mains and water service lines and house and
  - a. Water and sewer mains and water service lines and house and building sewer lines as defined in the North Carolina State Building Code, and water storage tanks, lift stations, pumping stations, and appurtenances to water storage tanks, lift stations and pumping stations;
    - b. Water and wastewater treatment facilities and appurtenances thereto;
  - c. Electrical power transmission facilities, and primary and secondary distribution facilities ahead of the point of delivery of electric service to the customer;

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1	d. Public communication distribution facilities; and
2	e. Natural gas and other petroleum products distribution facilities;
3	provided the General Contractors Licensing Board may issue
4	license to a public utilities contractor limited to any of the
5 6	above subclassifications for which the general contractor
0 7	<ul><li>qualifies, and</li><li>(4) Specialty contractor, which shall include those whose operations as</li></ul>
8	such are the performance of construction work requiring special skill
9	and involving the use of specialized building trades or crafts, but
0	which shall not include any operations now or hereafter under the
1	jurisdiction, for the issuance of license, by any board or commission
2	pursuant to the laws of the State of North Carolina.
3	Public utilities contractors constructing water service lines and house and building
4	sewer lines as provided in (3)a above shall terminate said lines at a valve, box, meter, or
5	manhole or cleanout at which the facilities from the building may be connected.
6	If an applicant is an individual, examination may be taken by his personal
17	appearance for examination, or by the appearance for examination of one or more of his
18	responsible managing employees, and if a copartnership or corporation, or any other
19	combination or organization, by the examination of one or more of the responsible
20 21	managing officers or members of the personnel of the applicant, and if the person so
21	examined shall cease to be connected with the applicant, then in such event the license shall remain in full force and effect for a period of 30 days thereafter, and then be
23	canceled, but the applicant shall then be entitled to a reexamination, all pursuant to the
24	rules to be promulgated by the Board: Provided, that the holder of such license shall not
25	bid on or undertake any additional contracts from the time such examined employee
26	shall cease to be connected with the applicant until said applicant's license is reinstated
27	as provided in this Article.
28	Anyone failing to pass this examination may be reexamined at any regular meeting
29	of the Board upon payment of an examination fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00).
30	Anyone requesting to take the examination a third or subsequent time shall submit a
31	new application with the appropriate examination and license fees. Certificate of license
32	shall expire on the thirty-first day of December following the issuance or renewal and
33	shall become invalid 60 days from that date unless renewed, subject to the approval of the Board Benevuels may be affected any time during the month of January without
84 85	the Board. Renewals may be effected any time during the month of January without reexamination, by the payment of a fee to the secretary of the Board of seventy-five
, s 86	dollars (\$75.00) for unlimited license, fifty dollars (\$50.00) for intermediate license and
,0 87	twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for limited license. <u>Renewal applications shall be</u>
8	accompanied by evidence of continued financial responsibility satisfactory to the Board.
9	Renewal applications received by the Board after January shall be accompanied by a
0	late payment of ten dollars (\$10.00) for each month or part after January. After a lapse
1	of two years no renewal shall be effected and the applicant shall fulfill all requirements
2	of a new applicant as set forth in this section."
