A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE TEACHING OF THE NATION'S FOUNDING AND		
3	RELATED DOCUMENTS IN THE NORTH CAROLINA HIGH SCHOOLS.		
4	Whereas, the adoption of the Declaration of Independence in 1776 and the		
5	signing of the United States Constitution were principal events in the history of the		
6	United States, the Declaration of Independence providing the philosophical foundation		
7	on which this nation rests and the Constitution of the United States providing its		
8	structure of government; and		
9	Whereas, the Federalist Papers embody the most eloquent and forceful		
10	argument made in support of the adoption of our republican form of government; and		
11	Whereas, these documents stand as the foundation of our form of democracy		
12	providing at the same time the touchstone of our national identity and the vehicle for		
13	orderly growth and change; and		
14	Whereas, many Americans lack even the most basic knowledge and		
15	understanding about the history of our nation and the principles set forth in the		
16	Declaration of Independence, codified in the Constitution and defended in the Federalist		
17	Papers; and		
18	Whereas, the survival of the republic requires that our nation's children, the		
19	future guardians of its heritage and participants in its governance, have a firm		
20	knowledge and understanding of its principles and history; Now, therefore,		
21	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
22	Section 1. G.S. 115C-81 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:		
23	"(<u>g</u>) <u>Civic Literacy.</u>

1	<u>(1)</u>	Local boards of education shall require during the high school years
2		the teaching of the nation's founding and related documents, which
3		shall include at least the major principles in the Declaration of
4		Independence, the United States Constitution, and the most important
5		of the Federalist Papers.
6	<u>(2)</u>	Local boards of education shall require that high school students
7		demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the nation's founding
8		and related documents in order to receive a certificate or diploma of
9		graduation from high school.
10	<u>(3)</u>	Local boards of education shall include among the requirements for
11		graduation from high school a passing grade in all courses that include
12		primary instruction in the Declaration of Independence, the United
13		States Constitution, and the most important of the Federalist Papers.
14	<u>(4)</u>	The State Board of Education shall require that any standardized tests
15		developed and administered statewide beginning with academic year
16		1990-91 include questions related to the Declaration of Independence,
17		the United States Constitution, and the most important of the
18		Federalist Papers.
19	<u>(5)</u>	The State Department of Public Instruction and the local boards of
20		education, as appropriate, shall establish curriculum content and
21		provide for teacher training to ensure that the intent and provisions of
22		this subsection are carried out."
23	Sec. 2	2. The State Superintendent of Public Instruction shall submit a biennial

25	Sec. 3	3. This act is effective upon ratification and shall apply beginning with
