1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE FOR EXPENDITURES, PERSONNEL COSTS, AND OPERATING CAPITAL EXPENSES FOR THE NORTH CAROLINA JUSTICE ACADEMY.

Whereas, the North Carolina General Assembly finds that all citizens must be able to enjoy the same level of quality in the enforcement of the State's criminal laws; and

Whereas, the quality of law enforcement must not be a function of the economic ability to pay on the part of any community, agency, or citizen; and

Whereas, the North Carolina Justice Academy, a division of the Department of Justice, provides important and critical basic and advanced law enforcement training to local and State agencies and officers; and

Whereas, the demands for the services of the North Carolina Justice Academy now critically exceed its capacity to meet those demands; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Capital Expenditures. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Justice, Justice Academy, the sum of three million eightyfour thousand one hundred dollars (\$3,084,100) for the 1989-90 fiscal year and the sum of one million three hundred fifty-four thousand two hundred dollars (\$1,354,200) for the 1990-91 fiscal year for capital expenditures as follows:
