### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

#### 2 AN ACT TO EXTEND TO MOST COMMUNITY COLLEGE BUILDINGS THE 3 REVIEW, SUPERVISION, AND INSPECTION OF ARCHITECTURE AND ENGINEERING BY THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION. 4 5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 143-336 reads as rewritten: 6 7 "§ 143-336. Definitions. As used in this Article: 8 9 'Agency' includes every agency, institution, board, commission, bureau, council, department, division, officer, and employee of the State, but does not include counties, 10 municipal corporations, political subdivisions, county and city boards of education, and 11 other local public bodies. 12

<u>'Community college buildings' means all buildings, utilities, and other property</u>
 <u>developments located at a community college, which is defined in G.S. 115D-2(2).</u>

15 'Department' means the Department of Administration, unless the context otherwise16 requires.

'Public buildings' means all buildings owned or maintained by the State in the City
of Raleigh, but does not mean any building which a State agency other than the
Department of Administration is required by law to care for and maintain.

<sup>20</sup> 'Public buildings and grounds' means all buildings and grounds owned or <sup>21</sup> maintained by the State in the City of Raleigh, but does not mean any building or <sup>22</sup> grounds which a State agency other than the Department of Administration is required <sup>23</sup> by law to care for and maintain.

7	except the State Legislative Building, railroads, highway structures, and bridge

33		accepted by the State or by any State agency until it has been approved
