A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR NURSING EDUCATION AND 3 TRAINING PROGRAMS.
- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. Recruitment. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers for use in developing more varied clinical training sites for nursing students. These funds shall be allocated among the schools of nursing within the community colleges and the constituent institutions of The University of North Carolina.

12 (b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 13 The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 14 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 1990-91 15 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers to provide information and training 16 programs which help retain new nursing graduates for employers of nurses.

17 (c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 18 The University of North Carolina the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) 19 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for 20 the 1990-91 fiscal year, to provide materials and training about health careers for 21 middle-school career exploration teachers.

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(Public)

There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of 1 (d)2 Community Colleges the sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for the 1989-90 3 fiscal year, and the sum of three million dollars (\$3,000,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used as supplemental funding for nursing education programs. All institutions 4 5 receiving this funding shall continue to fund their nursing programs from their regular 6 curriculum per student funding at a level equal to or above the level provided during the 7 1988-89 fiscal year. Any increases in regular curriculum per student funding shall also provide proportional increases in nursing programs. These directives are given to 8 9 guarantee that the supplemental funds provide additional resources for nursing 10 programs.

11 (e) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina 12 Foundation for Nursing, Inc., the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for 13 the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 14 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for covering the costs of promoting nursing as a 15 profession. These funds may not become a part of the continuation budget.

16 (f) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 17 The University of North Carolina, the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) 18 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, to be used for awarding competitive grants to the schools of 19 nursing of The University of North Carolina and of the community colleges for 20 innovative efforts to recruit various groups of students into the nursing schools. The 21 Board of Governors shall create an advisory group composed of the Deans of the 22 schools of nursing from The University of North Carolina and the community college system, selected administrators and officers of The University of North Carolina and the 23 24 community college system, and representatives of the nursing profession. The advisory 25 group shall set criteria for grant awards and shall make recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications received. Each grant recipient 26 27 shall submit an evaluation of its efforts to the Legislative Commission on Nursing, the 28 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, and the Department of 29 Community Colleges.

30 (g) There is appropriated from the General Fund to The University of North 31 Carolina Board of Governors, the sum of one hundred twenty-five thousand dollars 32 (\$125,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of one hundred twenty-five 33 thousand dollars (\$125,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used to continue and to 34 expand its pilot efforts in nursing recruitment.

(h) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors 35 of The University of North Carolina the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) 36 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for 37 38 the 1990-91 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers Program for the purpose 39 of increasing the availability of refresher courses for nurses. The Area Health Education Centers Program may use the funds as incentives to nursing schools which 40 provide courses to nurses who are subsequently relicensed by the North Carolina Board 41 42 of Nursing or who reenter the practice of nursing.

43 Sec. 2. Retention. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of 44 Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars

(\$75,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars 1 2 (\$75,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for the awarding of competitive grants 3 to employers of nurses for developing innovative pilot efforts to retain nurses in patient care. The Board of Governors shall create an advisory group composed of 4 representatives of the following: the North Carolina Hospital Association, the North 5 Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the North Carolina Association for Home 6 Care, private industry, and the nursing profession. The advisory group shall set criteria 7 8 for the solicitation of grant proposals and for the award of grant funds, and shall make 9 recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications 10 received. All grants shall require that an evaluation of each grant recipient's efforts be conducted and submitted to the Legislative Commission on Nursing within three years 11 12 of receipt of grant funds, and that the results of the evaluation be made available for 13 publication. Funds which are unspent at the end of the fiscal year may not revert to the 14 General Fund but shall remain available for the purposes stated herein.

15 There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of (b)16 The University of North Carolina the sum of two hundred twenty-five thousand dollars 17 (\$225,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of three hundred thirty-five 18 thousand dollars (\$335,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used to continue and to 19 expand pilot efforts to retain nurses in the nursing profession.

20 (c)There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Legislative Commission 21 on Nursing the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal 22 year, to be used to plan for a Center for Excellence in Nursing. The Legislative 23 Commission on Nursing may contract with other groups for this planning effort. In 24 contracting with other groups for the planning effort, the Legislative Commission on 25 Nursing shall comply with the provisions of G.S. 120-32.02.

There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 26 (d)27 The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) 28 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers Program to conduct 29 two pilot institute programs for nurses involved in direct patient care. The Director of 30 the Area Health Education Centers Program shall provide an evaluation of the pilot 31 institutes to the Legislative Commission on Nursing not later than May 1, 1990. The 32 evaluation shall include the institutes' effect on retaining nurses in the nursing profession. 33

Sec. 3. Education. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of 34 35 Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of two hundred forty thousand dollars (\$240,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of four hundred thousand 36 dollars (\$400,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, for the Area Health Education Centers 38 Program to use for targeting recruitment efforts for nursing schools, for improvement of 39 on-campus nursing programs for working registered nurses, and for the expansion of 40 off-campus nursing degree programs. The Area Health Education Centers Program shall report on the use of these funds to the General Assembly and the Legislative 41 42 Commission on Nursing not later than March 1, 1990.

There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of 43 (b)44 The University of North Carolina the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars

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1 (\$250,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of two hundred fifty thousand 2 dollars (\$250,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for funding need-based 3 scholarship loans for nursing students. Of the funds appropriated to the Board of 4 Governors, twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) shall be allocated for each fiscal year to 5 the State Education Assistance Authority for allocation to private colleges in North 6 Carolina which have nursing programs. These funds shall be administered in accordance 7 with Article 9C of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

8 (c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the State Board of 9 Community Colleges the sum of seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) for the 10 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of seven hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$750,000) for 11 the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for funding need-based scholarship loans for nursing 12 students. These funds shall be administered in accordance with the provisions of Article 13 9C of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes.

14 Sec. 4. Salary. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of 15 Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars 16 (\$50,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) 17 for the 1990-91 fiscal year, to be used for funding demonstration grants for employers 18 of nurses. The demonstration grants shall be competitive and shall be designed to 19 experiment with salary programs for nurses within professional practice models. These 20 funds may not be used to pay nursing salaries. The Board of Governors shall create an 21 advisory group composed of representatives of the following: the North Carolina 22 Hospital Association, the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the North 23 Carolina Association for Home Care, private industry, and the nursing profession. The 24 advisory group shall set criteria for grant awards, and shall make recommendations for 25 the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications received. Grant criteria shall 26 include the requirement that there be an evaluation and reporting of the results of the 27 grant project to the Legislative Commission on Nursing, the Board of Governors of The 28 University of North Carolina, the North Carolina Hospital Association, and the North 29 Carolina Health Care Facilities Association.

30 There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of (b)31 The University of North Carolina the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the 32 1989-90 fiscal year, and the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the 1990-91 33 fiscal year, to be used to fund demonstration grants for employers of nurses. The grants 34 shall be competitive and shall be designed to stimulate innovative approaches to 35 providing child care and flexible fringe benefit plans for nurses. These funds may not be used to pay nursing salaries. The Board of Governors shall create an advisory group 36 37 composed of representatives of the following: the North Carolina Hospital Association, 38 the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the North Carolina Association 39 for Home Care, private industry, and the nursing profession. The advisory group shall 40 set criteria for the award of grants and shall make recommendations for the selection of 41 grant recipients based on grant applications received. Grant criteria shall include the 42 requirement that there be an evaluation and reporting of the results of the grant project to the Legislative Commission on Nursing, the Board of Governors of The University of 43

North Carolina, the North Carolina Hospital Association, and the North Carolina Health
Care Facilities Association.

3 There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of (c) The University of North Carolina the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) 4 5 for the 1989-90 fiscal year, to be used to provide competitive demonstration grants to 6 health care facilities for the improvement of nursing support services and productivity 7 efforts, which may include computerization efforts. The Board of Governors shall 8 create an advisory group, the membership of which shall include representatives of the 9 following: the North Carolina Hospital Association, the North Carolina Health Facilities 10 Association, the North Carolina Association for Home Care, private industry, and the nursing profession. The advisory group shall set criteria for the award of grants, 11 12 including the potential for the proposed project's replication at other facilities, and shall 13 make recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications 14 received. Awards criteria shall include the requirement that an evaluation report on the 15 results of the project be conducted and submitted to the Legislative Commission on 16 Nursing, the Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina, and other entities 17 designated by the Board of Governors. Funds which are unspent at the end of each fiscal year may not revert to the General Fund but shall remain available for the 18 19 purposes designated herein. 20 (d) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of Governors of

21 The University of North Carolina the sum of fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 22 1989-90 fiscal year to be used for incentive planning grants for the development of 23 integrated pay, career advancement, and education plans for nurses. The Board of 24 Governors shall create an advisory group composed of representatives of the following: 25 the North Carolina Hospital Association, the North Carolina Health Care Facilities Association, the North Carolina Association for Home Care, private industry, and the 26 27 nursing profession. The advisory group shall set criteria for grant awards and shall make recommendations for the selection of grant recipients based on grant applications 28 29 received. Grant awards shall be designed to stimulate plans which are applicable to 30 various types and sizes of health care institutions, and shall require that evaluations of 31 the project be conducted and reported to the Legislative Commission on Nursing and 32 other entities designated by the Board of Governors.

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Sec. 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.

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
