# March 14, 1989

### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE NORTH CAROLINA POVERTY PROJECT, INC., FOR PERSONNEL AND OPERATING EXPENSES OF THE POVERTY INFORMATION SERVICE.

Whereas, in North Carolina there are nearly one million persons living in poverty, which is twenty percent (20%) higher than the national average; and

Whereas, poverty is a waste of human resources, an economic drain on society, and will handicap the future of North Carolina; and

Whereas, during the 1960's the federal government assumed responsibility for establishing policies, strategies, and funding for dealing with poverty; and

Whereas, during the 1980's the federal government cut back, and much responsibility for policies, strategies, and funding has been shifted to the states and local governments; and

Whereas, fulfilling the State's responsibility for establishing more effective policies for dealing with poverty in North Carolina requires comprehensive information both about the poverty situation and about the many governmental and private programs attempting to deal with poverty in the State; and

Whereas, efforts to deal with poverty have never been addressed on a statewide basis in a coordinated way because such information was not available; and

Whereas, the North Carolina Poverty Project, Inc., is a private, independent, nonpartisan organization providing statewide educational programs engaging persons of many sectors in addressing their civic responsibility for dealing with the blight of poverty; and

Whereas, the North Carolina Poverty Project has found widespread need by
government departments, legislative committees, schools, colleges and universities, and
the media for reliable data and other information about North Carolina poverty and the
many poverty programs; and

Whereas, the North Carolina Poverty Project is seeking to add a readily available special service providing comprehensive, up-to-date information about poverty and poverty programs in North Carolina; Now, therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

 Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to The North Carolina Poverty Project, Inc., the sum of one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000) for the 1989-90 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000) for the 1990-91 fiscal year for personnel and operating expenses of the poverty information service.

Sec. 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
