shall find: a low potential for abuse relative to the substances listed in Schedule IV of 1 2 this Article; currently accepted medical use in the United States; and limited physical or 3 psychological dependence relative to the substances listed in Schedule IV of this Article. The following controlled substances are included in this schedule: 4 5 Any compound, mixture or preparation containing any of the 6 following limited quantities of narcotic drugs or salts thereof, which 7 shall include one or more nonnarcotic active medicinal ingredients in 8 sufficient proportion to confer upon the compound, mixture, or 9 preparation valuable medicinal qualities other than those possessed by 10 the narcotic alone: Not more than 200 milligrams of codeine or any of its salts 11 (i) 12 per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams. Not more than 100 milligrams of dihydrocodeine or any of 13 (ii) 14 its salts per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams. 15 (iii) Not more than 100 milligrams of ethylmorphine or any of its salts per 100 milliliters or per 100 grams. 16 17 (iv) Not more than 2.5 milligrams of diphenoxylate and not less 18 than 25 micrograms of atropine sulfate per dosage unit. Not more than 100 milligrams of opium per 100 milliliters 19 (v) 20 or per 100 grams. 21 (vi) Not more than 0.5 milligram of different and not less than 25 micrograms of atropine sulfate per dosage unit. 22 23 2. Repealed by Session Laws 1985, c. 172, s. 9, effective May 10, 1985. 24 3. Stimulants. - Unless specifically exempted or excluded or unless listed in another schedule, any material, compound, mixture, or preparation 25 which contains any quantity of the following substances having a 26 stimulant effect on the central nervous system, including its salts, 27 isomers and salts of isomers: 28 Propvlhexedrine. 29 a. Pyrovalerone." 30 b. Sec. 4. G.S. 90-101(i) reads as rewritten: 31

A physician licensed by the Board of Medical Examiners pursuant to Article "(i) 1 of this Chapter may dispense or administer Dronabinol or Nabilone as scheduled in G.S. 90-90(e) only as an antiemetic agent in cancer chemotherapy."
