Section 1. Effective July 1, 1989, G.S. 7A-133 reads as rewritten:

"§ 7A-133. Numbers of judges by districts; numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, by counties.

Each district court district shall have the numbers of judges and each county within the district shall have the numbers of magistrates and additional seats of court, as set forth in the following table:

Sec. 2. The judgeship created by this act shall be filled by a judge elected in the general election of November 1990, to serve a four-year term beginning the first Monday in December 1990.

Sec. 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of fifty-two thousand three hundred seventy dollars (\$52,370) to implement this act.

Sec. 4. This act shall become effective July 1, 1989.
