Technical Considerations/Comments

There is no state or county costs associated with the implementation of Senate Bill 856. Chapter 574 (H 134) of the 1987 Session Laws created a state Superfund law to provide for the clean up of inactive sites containing hazardous wastes and substances, not covered under the federal Superfund program. The law also created the Carolina Clean Drinking Water Fund, the source of payment of the clean up costs. The Carolina Clean Drinking Water Fund, is funded by appropriations and monies that are recovered in reimbursement actions under the Act. The proposed legislation would simply make statutory changes which currently refers to the Carolina Clean Drinking Water Fund; the Carolina Clean Drinking Water Fund name would be changed to the Inactive Hazardous Sites Cleanup Fund.
