1 A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE LIFE AND MEMORY OF CARSON
2 GREGORY, FORMER MEMBER OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY.

3 Whereas, Carson Gregory was born on Route 2 in Angier, North Carolina, on
4 August 11, 1911, to Alex and Carra Parrish Gregory; and

5 Whereas, Carson Gregory was educated in the Harnett County schools and
6 attended Campbell College; and

7 Whereas, Carson Gregory was a farmer and businessman; and

8 Whereas, Carson Gregory served with honor and distinction in the North
9 Carolina House of Representatives for 10 terms, during the 1951 through the 1965
10 Sessions and the 1975 through the 1977 Sessions; and

11 Whereas, Carson Gregory served as president of the Good Hope Hospital
12 Board of Directors and as president of the North Carolina Spotted Swine Association
13 and the Harnett County Farm Bureau; and

14 Whereas, Carson Gregory was a member of the board of directors of First
15 Citizens Bank, the National Spotted Swine Association, Terri Hill Manufacturing, and
16 the North Carolina Pork Producers; and

17 Whereas, Carson Gregory was a member of the Erwin Chamber of
18 Commerce and a charter member of the Coats Chamber of Commerce and the Coats
19 Lions Club; and

20 Whereas, Carson Gregory was a friend to the disabled, serving on the Board
21 of Directors of the Harnett County Association for Mentally Retarded Children and the
22 Harnett County Sheltered Workshop; and

1 Whereas, Carson Gregory was a member of several fraternal organizations,
2 including the Masons, the Shriners, the Dunn-Erwin Woodmen of the World, and the
3 Coats Hunting and Fishing Club; and

4 Whereas, Carson Gregory was active in the Coats First Baptist Church,
5 serving on the finance committee; and

6 Whereas, Carson Gregory died on February 24, 1991; and

7 Whereas, Carson Gregory is survived by his wife, Blanche Williams Gregory,
8 and his children, Joe Gregory and Frances G. Avery; and

9 Whereas, Carson Gregory will be remembered by all who knew him as a man
10 devoted to his family, to his community, and to public service;

11 Now, therefore, be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:

12 Section 1. The General Assembly expresses its appreciation for the life and
13 public service of Carson Gregory and honors his memory.

14 Sec. 2. The General Assembly extends its deepest sympathy to the family
15 and friends of Carson Gregory for the loss of a beloved husband, father, and friend.

16 Sec. 3. The Secretary of State shall transmit a certified copy of this resolution
17 to the family of Carson Gregory.

18 Sec. 4. This resolution is effective upon ratification.
