Section 1. G.S. 14-33(b) reads as rewritten:

- "(b) Unless his conduct is covered under some other provision of law providing greater punishment, any person who commits any assault, assault and battery, or affray is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine, imprisonment for not more than two years, or both such fine and imprisonment if, in the course of the assault, assault and battery, or affray, he:
 - (1) Inflicts, or attempts to inflict, serious injury upon another person or uses a deadly weapon; or
 - (2) Assaults a female, he being a male person at least 18 years of age; or
 - (3) Assaults a child under the age of 12 years; or
 - (4) to (7). Repealed by Session Laws 1991, c. 525, s. 1.
 - (8) Assaults an officer or employee of the State or of any political subdivision of the State, a company police officer, or a campus police officer, when the officer or employee is discharging or attempting to discharge his official duties."
 - Sec. 2. G.S. 14-34.2 reads as rewritten:

"§ 14-34.2. Assault with a firearm or other deadly weapon upon governmental
officers or employees, employees, company police officers, or campus
police officers.
Any person who commits an assault with a firearm or any other deadly weapon upon
an officer or amployee of the State or of any political subdivision of the State State

Any person who commits an assault with a firearm or any other deadly weapon upon an officer or employee of the State or of any political subdivision of the State State, company police officers, or campus police officers, in the performance of his duties shall be guilty of a Class I felony."

Sec. 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 1993, and applies to offenses occurring on or after that date.
