## GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF NORTH CAROLINA

#### "§ 14-34.2. Assault with a firearm or other deadly weapon upon governmental 1 2 officers or employees, employees, company police officers, or campus 3 police officers. Any person who commits an assault with a firearm or any other deadly weapon upon 4 an officer or employee of the State or of any political subdivision of the State State, a 5 6 company police officer certified pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 74E of the General Statutes, or a campus police officer certified pursuant to the provisions of 7 8 Chapter 17C or Chapter 116 of the General Statutes, in the performance of his duties shall be guilty of a Class F felony." 9 Sec. 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 1994, and applies to offenses 10 occurring on or after that date. 11
