Chapter 20 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: 9 10 "§ 20-49.1. Assistance by Division officers and agents. The Commissioner and any officers and inspectors of the Division that he designates shall have authority to enforce the criminal laws of this State under the following 12 circumstances: 13 14 The officer or inspector has probable cause to believe that a person (1) committed a criminal offense in his presence and at the time of the 15 violation the officer or inspector is engaged in the enforcement of laws 16 otherwise within his subject-matter jurisdiction; 17 18 The officer or inspector is asked to provide temporary assistance by a (2) State or local law enforcement officer who at the time of the request is 19

acting within the scope of his subject-matter and territorial jurisdiction;

The officer or inspector is asked to provide temporary assistance by the head of a State or local law enforcement agency or his designee

1	and the request is within the scope of the agency's subject-matter and
2	territorial jurisdiction.
3	While acting pursuant to this section, an officer or inspector shall have the same
4	powers invested in law enforcement officers by statute or common law. In addition, an
5	officer or inspector who acts pursuant to this section shall not be construed to expand
6	the authority of officers or inspectors to initiate or conduct an independent investigation
7	into violations of criminal laws outside the scope of their subject-matter or territorial
8	jurisdiction.
9	The powers granted by this section are in addition to any other powers the officers or
10	inspectors have according to law."
11	Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
