1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2 AN ACT TO ADD FIVE ADDITIONAL MEMBERS TO THE SITE-BASED
3 MANAGEMENT TASK FORCE.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 Section 1. G.S. 115C-238.7(a) reads as rewritten:

6 "(a) There is created the Task Force on Site-Based Management within the
7 Department of Public Instruction.

8 The Task Force shall be composed of ~~15-20~~ members appointed as follows:

- 9 (1) The Superintendent of Public Instruction;
- 10 (2) One member of the State Board of Education appointed by the State
11 Board of Education;
- 12 (3) Two members of the Senate appointed by the President Pro Tempore
13 of the Senate;
- 14 (4) Two members of the House of Representatives appointed by the
15 Speaker of the House of Representatives;
- 16 (5) One member of a local board of education appointed by the President
17 Pro Tempore of the Senate after receiving recommendations from The
18 North Carolina State School Boards Association, Inc.;
- 19 (6) One member of a local board of education appointed by the Speaker of
20 the House of Representatives after receiving recommendations from
21 The North Carolina State School Boards Association, Inc.;

- 1 (7) One local school superintendent appointed by the President Pro
2 Tempore of the Senate after receiving recommendations from the
3 North Carolina Association of School Administrators;
- 4 (8) One local school superintendent appointed by the Speaker of the
5 House of Representatives after receiving recommendations from the
6 North Carolina Association of School Administrators;
- 7 (9) One school principal appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
8 Senate after receiving recommendations from the Tar Heel Association
9 of Principals/Assistant Principals and the Division of Administrators
10 of the North Carolina Association of Educators;
- 11 (10) One school principal appointed by the Speaker of the House of
12 Representatives after receiving recommendations from the Tar Heel
13 Association of Principals/Assistant Principals and the Division of
14 Administrators of the North Carolina Association of Educators;
- 15 (11) One school teacher appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the
16 Senate after receiving recommendations from the North Carolina
17 Association of Educators, Inc., the North Carolina Federation of
18 Teachers, and the Professional Educators of North Carolina, Inc.;
- 19 (12) One school teacher appointed by the Speaker of the House of
20 Representatives after receiving recommendations from the North
21 Carolina Association of Educators, Inc., the North Carolina Federation
22 of Teachers, and the Professional Educators of North Carolina, Inc.;
- 23 ~~and~~
- 24 (13) The Director of the Task Force on Site-Based Management, appointed
25 by the Superintendent of Public Instruction in accordance with
26 subsection (d) of this ~~section~~-section;
- 27 (14) One parent of a public school child appointed by the Superintendent
28 of Public Instruction;
- 29 (15) One at-large member appointed by the Superintendent of Public
30 Instruction;
- 31 (16) One representative of business and industry appointed by the
32 Governor;
- 33 (17) One representative of institutions of higher education appointed by the
34 Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina; and
- 35 (18) One county commissioner appointed by the Superintendent of Public
36 Instruction after receiving recommendations from the North Carolina
37 Association of County Commissioners.

38 Members of the Task Force shall serve for two-year terms.

39 All members of the Task Force shall be voting members. Vacancies in the appointed
40 membership shall be filled by the officer who made the initial appointment. The
41 Director of the Task Force on Site-Based Management shall serve as chair of the Task
42 Force.

43 Members of the Task Force shall receive travel and subsistence expenses in
44 accordance with the provisions of G.S. 120-3.1, G.S. 138-5, and G.S. 138-6."

1 Sec. 2. Members appointed in accordance with this act shall serve until
2 September 1, 1994, and shall be eligible for reappointment. Successive appointments
3 shall be for two-year terms. The Task Force shall use funds available to it for the 1992-
4 93 fiscal year for travel and subsistence expenses for members of the Task Force added
5 pursuant to this act.

6 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
