2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF
3	ENVIRONMENT, HEALTH, AND NATURAL RESOURCES FOR A
4	BACTERIOLOGICAL LABORATORY FOR THE SHELLFISH SANITATION
5	BRANCH.
6	Whereas, the present bacteriological laboratory serving the southeastern
7	portion of North Carolina is located on UNC-Wilmington property; and
8	Whereas, this property will not be available after three more years; and
9	Whereas, there will be a continuing need for a laboratory in this area to
10	determine water quality so that shellfish waters can be opened either temporarily or on
11	an indefinite basis; and
12	Whereas, there are good resources of clams and oysters in the counties of
13	Pender, New Hanover, and Brunswick; and
14	Whereas, the harvest of shellfish is an important part of the economy of these
15	counties; and
16	Whereas, the protection of public health is the primary purpose of the
17	Shellfish Sanitation Branch of the Department of Environment, Health, and Natural
18	Resources; Now, therefore,
19	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
20	Section 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Division of
21	Environmental Health, Department of Environment, Health, and Natural Resources, the
22	sum of two hundred ninety-six thousand three hundred fifty-two dollars (\$296,352) for
23	the 1994-95 fiscal year for the following purposes:
24	(1) To retain an architect to design a bacteriological laboratory.

1	(2) To complete a lease agreement with UNC-Wilmington for a building
2	site on Masonboro Loop Road property.
3	(3) To construct a bacteriological laboratory for the Shellfish Sanitation
4	Branch, Division of Environmental Health, Department of
5	Environment, Health, and Natural Resources.
6	Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1994.
