5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
6	Section 1. The Governor shall examine public safety services in Butner. The	
7	study shall provide a detailed evaluation of the following options:	
8	(1)	G.S. 153A-301 should be amended to allow counties to create Public
9		Safety Districts, and the creation of such a district in Durham and
10		Granville Counties to serve Butner, which district could levy local
11		property taxes in unincorporated areas for public safety services;
12	(2)	Incorporation of Butner; or
13	(3)	No change.
14	Sec. 2. The results of the study shall be reported to the General Assembly no	
15	later than convening of the 1994 Regular Session of the 1993 General Session. The	
16	study should address:	
17	(1)	Unique needs of the State institutions;
18	(2)	Needs of local residents;
19	(3)	Services that would be provided by an incorporated Town of Butner,
20		such as fire, police protection, water, and sewer;
21	(4)	Services that would be provided by a stand-alone public safety district;
22	(5)	The impact on other local governments of incorporating Butner or
23		establishing a public safety district;

- Sec. 3. The Governor should provide participation in the study to Granville 4
