A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO REMOVE THE REQUIREMENT THAT THE REGISTER OF DEEDS
2 PROVIDE THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS WITH A JUSTIFICATION FOR
3 HAVING A SECOND DEPUTY.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1. G.S. 153A-103 reads as rewritten:

7 "**§ 153A-103. Number of employees in offices of sheriff and register of deeds.**

8 Subject to the limitations set forth below, the board of commissioners may fix the
9 number of salaried employees in the offices of the sheriff and the register of deeds. In
10 exercising the authority granted by this section, the board of commissioners is subject to
11 the following limitations:

12 (1) Each sheriff and register of deeds elected by the people has the
13 exclusive right to hire, discharge, and supervise the employees in his
14 office. However, the board of commissioners must approve the
15 appointment by such an officer of a relative by blood or marriage of
16 nearer kinship than first cousin or of a person who has been convicted
17 of a crime involving moral turpitude.

18 (2) Each sheriff and register of deeds elected by the people is entitled to at
19 least two deputies who shall be reasonably compensated by the ~~county,~~
20 ~~county.~~ ~~provided that the register of deeds justifies to the Board of~~
21 ~~County Commissioners the necessity of the second deputy.~~ Each
22 deputy so appointed shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing
23 officer.

1 Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this section, approval of the board of
2 commissioners is not required for the reappointment or continued employment of a near
3 relative of a sheriff or register of deeds who was not related to the appointing officer at
4 the time of initial appointment."

5 Sec. 2. This act is effective on July 1, 1993.
