4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5	Section 1. G.S. 18B-103 reads as rewritten:			
6	"§ 18B-103. Exemptions.			
7	The following activities shall be permitted:			
8	(1)	The use of ethyl alcohol for scientific, chemical, pharmaceutical,		
9		mechanical, and industrial purposes;		
10	(2)	The use of ethyl alcohol by persons authorized to obtain it tax free, as		
11		provided by federal law;		
12	(3)	The use of ethyl alcohol in the manufacture and preparation of any		
13		product unfit for use as a beverage;		
14	(4)	The use of alcoholic beverages by licensed physicians, druggists, or		
15		dental surgeons for medicinal or pharmaceutical purposes; or the use		
16		of alcoholic beverages by medical facilities established and maintained		
17		for the treatment of patients addicted to the use of alcohol or drugs;		
18	(5)	The use of grain alcohol by college, university or State laboratories,		
19		and by manufacturers of medicine, for compounding, mixing, or		
20		preserving medicines or medical preparations, or for surgical purposes;		
21	(6)	The manufacture, importation, and possession of denatured alcohol		
22		produced and used as provided by federal law;		
23	(7)	The manufacture or sale of cider or vinegar;		

1	(8)	The possession and use of unfortified wine or fortified wine for
2		sacramental purpose by any organized church or ordained minister,
3		including in public school buildings when the use of those buildings is
4		approved by the local school board;
5	(9)	The possession and use of alcohol acquired for controlled-drinking
5		programs as authorized under G.S. 20-139.1(g).
7	<u>(10)</u>	The use of spirituous liquor in the manufacture of food extracts."
3	Sec. 2	2. This act is effective upon ratification.
