A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT PERTAINING TO THE DETERMINATION OF CONTRIBUTORY

MISCONDUCT UNDER THE CRIME VICTIMS COMPENSATION ACT AND

TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE CRIME VICTIMS COMPENSATION

FUND.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. G.S. 15B-11(b) reads as rewritten:

- "(b) A claim may be denied and an award of compensation may be reduced upon finding contributory misconduct by the claimant or a victim through whom he claims. Contributory misconduct includes a finding by the Commission that the victim was engaged in criminal activity at or about the time that the victim's injury occurred."
- Sec. 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Crime Control and Public Safety the sum of three million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$3,800,000) for the 1994-95 fiscal year to support the Crime Victims Compensation Fund.
- Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification except that Section 2 of this act becomes effective July 1, 1994.
