A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO INCREASE THE PUNISHMENT UNDER STRUCTURED SENTENCING FOR FIRST DEGREE RAPE AND FIRST DEGREE SEXUAL OFFENSE, INCLUDING LIFE WITHOUT PAROLE FOR THE AGGRAVATED RANGE OF PRIOR RECORD LEVELS V AND VI.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 14-27.2(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Any person who commits an offense defined in this section is guilty of a Class ~~B~~B1 felony."

Sec. 2. G.S. 14-27.4(b) reads as rewritten:

"(b) Any person who commits an offense defined in this section is guilty of a Class ~~B~~B1 felony."

Sec. 3. G.S. 14-17, as amended by Section 1127 of Chapter 539 of the 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

"§ 14-17. Murder in the first and second degree defined; punishment.

A murder which shall be perpetrated by means of poison, lying in wait, imprisonment, starving, torture, or by any other kind of willful, deliberate, and premeditated killing, or which shall be committed in the perpetration or attempted perpetration of any arson, rape or a sex offense, robbery, kidnapping, burglary, or other felony committed or attempted with the use of a deadly weapon shall be deemed to be murder in the first degree, a Class A felony, and any person who commits such murder

1 shall be punished with death or imprisonment in the State's prison for life as the court
2 shall determine pursuant to G.S. 15A-2000, except that any such person who was under
3 17 years of age at the time of the murder shall be punished with imprisonment in the
4 State's prison for life. Provided, however, any person under the age of 17 who commits
5 murder in the first degree while serving a prison sentence imposed for a prior murder or
6 while on escape from a prison sentence imposed for a prior murder shall be punished
7 with death or imprisonment in the State's prison for life as the court shall determine
8 pursuant to G.S. 15A-2000. All other kinds of murder, including that which shall be
9 proximately caused by the unlawful distribution of opium or any synthetic or natural
10 salt, compound, derivative, or preparation of opium, or cocaine or other substance
11 described in G.S. 90-90(a)4., when the ingestion of such substance causes the death of
12 the user, shall be deemed murder in the second degree, and any person who commits
13 such murder shall be punished as a Class ~~B~~B2 felon."

14 Sec. 4. G.S. 14-20, as amended by Section 1129 of Chapter 539 of the 1993
15 Session Laws, read as rewritten:

16 "**§ 14-20. Killing adversary in duel; aiders and abettors declared accessories.**

17 If any person fight a duel in consequence of a challenge sent or received, and either
18 of the parties shall be killed, then the survivor, on conviction thereof, shall be punished
19 as a Class ~~B~~B2 felon. All their aiders and abettors shall be considered accessories
20 before the fact.

21 Any person charged with killing an adversary in a duel may enter a plea of guilty to
22 said charge in the same way and manner and under the conditions and restrictions set
23 forth in G.S. 15-162.1 relating to pleas of guilty for first degree murder, first degree
24 burglary, arson and rape."

25 Sec. 5. G.S. 14-5.2 reads as rewritten:

26 "**§ 14-5.2. Accessory before fact punishable as principal felon.**

27 All distinctions between accessories before the fact and principals to the commission
28 of a felony are abolished. Every person who heretofore would have been guilty as an
29 accessory before the fact to any felony shall be guilty and punishable as a principal to
30 that felony. However, if a person who heretofore would have been guilty and punishable
31 as an accessory before the fact is convicted of a capital felony, and the jury finds that his
32 conviction was based solely on the uncorroborated testimony of one or more principals,
33 coconspirators, or accessories to the crime, he shall be guilty of a Class ~~B~~B2 felony."

34 Sec. 6. G.S. 15A-1371(a1), as amended by Section 22 of Chapter 538 of the
35 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

36 "(a1) A prisoner serving a term of life imprisonment for a Class A felony is eligible
37 for parole after serving 25 years. A prisoner serving a term of life imprisonment for
38 first degree rape or first degree sexual offense shall be imprisoned for the remainder of
39 the prisoner's natural life. This subsection applies to offenses committed on and after
40 January 1, 1995."

41 Sec. 7. G.S. 15A-1340.17, as enacted by Section 1 of Chapter 538 of the
42 1993 Session Laws and as amended by Sections 20 and 21 of Chapter 14 of the Session
43 Laws of the 1994 Extra Session, reads as rewritten:

44 "**§ 15A-1340.17. Punishment limits for each class of offense and prior record level.**

1 (a) Offense Classification; Default Classifications. – The offense classification is
 2 as specified in the offense for which the sentence is being imposed. If the offense is a
 3 felony for which there is no classification, it is a Class I felony.

4 (b) Fines. – Any judgment that includes a sentence of imprisonment may also
 5 include a fine. If a community punishment is authorized, the judgment may consist of a
 6 fine only. Additionally, when the defendant is other than an individual, the judgment
 7 may consist of a fine only. Unless otherwise provided, the amount of the fine is in the
 8 discretion of the court.

9 (c) Punishments for Each Class of Offense and Prior Record Level; Punishment
 10 Chart Described. – The authorized punishment for each class of offense and prior record
 11 level is as specified in the chart below. Prior record levels are indicated by the Roman
 12 numerals placed horizontally on the top of the chart. Classes of offense are indicated by
 13 the letters placed vertically on the left side of the chart. Each cell on the chart contains
 14 the following components:

- 15 (1) A sentence disposition or dispositions: 'C' indicates that a community
 16 punishment is authorized; 'I' indicates that an intermediate punishment
 17 is authorized; ~~and 'A' indicates that an active punishment is authorized.~~
 18 authorized; and 'Life Imprisonment Without Parole' indicates that the
 19 defendant shall be imprisoned for the remainder of the prisoner's
 20 natural life.
- 21 (2) A presumptive range of minimum durations, if the sentence of
 22 imprisonment is neither aggravated or mitigated; any minimum term of
 23 imprisonment in that range is permitted unless the court finds pursuant
 24 to G.S. 15A-1340.16 that an aggravated or mitigated sentence is
 25 appropriate. The presumptive range is the middle of the three ranges
 26 in the cell.
- 27 (3) A mitigated range of minimum durations if the court finds pursuant to
 28 G.S. 15A-1340.16 that a mitigated sentence of imprisonment is
 29 justified; in such a case, any minimum term of imprisonment in the
 30 mitigated range is permitted. The mitigated range is the lower of the
 31 three ranges in the cell.
- 32 (4) An aggravated range of minimum durations if the court finds pursuant
 33 to G.S. 15A-1340.16 that an aggravated sentence of imprisonment is
 34 justified; in such a case, any minimum term of imprisonment in the
 35 aggravated range is permitted. The aggravated range is the higher of
 36 the three ranges in the cell.

27 (e1) Maximum Sentences Specified for Class B1 through Class E Felonies for
 28 Minimum Terms of 340 Months or More. – Unless provided otherwise in a statute
 29 establishing a punishment for a specific crime, when the minimum sentence is 340
 30 months or more, the corresponding maximum term of imprisonment shall be equal to
 31 the sum of the minimum term of imprisonment and twenty percent (20%) of the
 32 minimum term of imprisonment, rounded to the next highest month, plus nine additional
 33 months."

34 Sec. 8. G.S. 15A-1368.1, as enacted by Section 20.1 of Chapter 538 of the
 35 1993 Session Laws and as amended by Section 26 of Chapter 14 of the Session Laws of
 36 the 1994 Extra Session, reads as rewritten:

37 **"§ 15A-1368.1. Applicability of Article 84A.**

38 This Article applies to all felons in Class ~~B~~B1 through Class E sentenced to an
 39 active punishment under Article 81B of this ~~Chapter~~Chapter, but does not apply to
 40 felons in Class B1 sentenced to life imprisonment without parole. Prisoners subject to
 41 Articles 85 and 85A of this Chapter are excluded from this Article's coverage."

42 Sec. 9. G.S. 15A-1340.13(h), as enacted by Section 1 of Chapter 538 of the
 43 1993 Session Laws and as amended by Section 19 of Chapter 14 of the Session Laws of
 44 the 1994 Extra Session, reads as rewritten:

1 "(h) Exceptions When Extraordinary Mitigation Shall Not Be Used. – The court
2 shall not impose an intermediate sanction pursuant to subsection (g) of this section if:

- 3 (1) The offense is a Class A or Class B1 felony;
- 4 (2) The offense is a drug trafficking offense under G.S. 90-95(h); or
- 5 (3) The defendant has five or more points as determined by G.S. 15A-
6 1340.14."

7 Sec. 10. G.S. 15A-1340.14(b), as enacted by Section 1 of Chapter 538 of the
8 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

9 "(b) Points. – Points are assigned as follows:

- 10 (1) For each prior felony Class A conviction, 10 points.
- 11 (1a) For each prior felony Class B1 conviction, 9 points.
- 12 (2) For each prior felony Class ~~B~~, B2, C, or D conviction, 6 points.
- 13 (3) For each prior felony Class E, F, or G conviction, 4 points.
- 14 (4) For each prior felony Class H or I conviction, 2 points.
- 15 (5) For each prior Class 1 misdemeanor conviction, 1 point, except
16 that convictions for Class 1 misdemeanor offenses under Chapter 20 of
17 the General Statutes, other than conviction for misdemeanor death by
18 vehicle (G.S. 20-141.4(a2)), shall not be assigned any points for
19 purposes of determining a person's prior record for felony sentencing.
- 20 (6) If all the elements of the present offense are included in the prior
21 offense, 1 point.
- 22 (7) If the offense was committed while the offender was on probation or
23 parole, or while the offender was serving a sentence of imprisonment,
24 or while the offender was on escape from a correctional institution
25 while serving a sentence of imprisonment, 1 point."

26 Sec. 11. G.S. 15A-1372(a), as amended by Section 23 of Chapter 538 of the
27 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

28 "(a) Term of Parole. – The term of parole for any person released from
29 imprisonment may be no greater than:

- 30 (1) One year for a conviction for impaired driving under G.S. 20-138.1; or
- 31 (2) Three years for a sentence of life ~~imprisonment~~ imprisonment for
32 which parole is allowed."

33 Sec. 12. G.S. 143B-266(a), as amended by Section 42 of Chapter 538 of the
34 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

35 "(a) There is hereby created a Post-Release Supervision and Parole Commission
36 of the Department of Correction with the authority to grant paroles, including both
37 regular and temporary paroles, to persons held by virtue of any final order or judgment
38 of any court of this State as provided in Chapter 148 of the General Statutes and laws of
39 the State of North Carolina, except that for persons sentenced under Article 81B of
40 Chapter 15A of the General Statutes, only those sentenced to life imprisonment for first
41 degree murder are eligible for parole. The Commission shall also have authority to
42 revoke, terminate, and suspend paroles of such persons (including persons placed on
43 parole on or before the effective date of the Executive Organization Act of 1973) and to
44 assist the Governor in exercising his authority in granting reprieves, commutations, and

1 pardons, and shall perform such other services as may be required by the Governor in
2 exercising his powers of executive clemency. The Commission shall also have
3 authority to revoke and terminate persons on post-release supervision, as provided in
4 Article 84A of Chapter 15A of the General Statutes."

5 Sec. 13. G.S. 14-2.5, as enacted by Section 6 of Chapter 538 of the 1993
6 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

7 "**§ 14-2.5. Punishment for attempt to commit a felony or misdemeanor.**

8 Unless a different classification is expressly stated, an attempt to commit a
9 misdemeanor or a felony is punishable under the next lower classification as the offense
10 which the offender attempted to commit. An attempt to commit a Class A or Class B1
11 felony is a Class B2 felony, an attempt to commit a Class B2 felony is a Class C felony,
12 an attempt to commit a Class I felony is a Class 1 misdemeanor, and an attempt to
13 commit a Class 3 misdemeanor is a Class 3 misdemeanor."

14 Sec. 14. G.S. 14-2.4(a), as amended by Section 5 of Chapter 538 of the 1993
15 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

16 "(a) Unless a different classification is expressly stated, a person who is convicted
17 of a conspiracy to commit a felony is guilty of a felony that is one class lower than the
18 felony he or she conspired to commit, except that a conspiracy to commit a Class A or
19 Class B1 felony is a Class B2 felony, a conspiracy to commit a Class B2 felony is a
20 Class C felony, and a conspiracy to commit a Class I felony is a Class 1 misdemeanor."

21 Sec. 15. G.S. 14-2.6(a), as enacted by Section 6.1 of Chapter 538 of the 1993
22 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:

23 "(a) Unless a different classification is expressly stated, a person who solicits
24 another person to commit a felony is guilty of a felony that is two classes lower than the
25 felony the person solicited the other person to commit, except that a solicitation to
26 commit a Class A or Class B1 felony is a Class C felony, a solicitation to commit a
27 Class B2 felony is a Class D felony, a solicitation to commit a Class H felony is a Class
28 1 misdemeanor, and a solicitation to commit a Class I felony is a Class 2 misdemeanor."

29 Sec. 16. This act becomes effective on the same date that Chapter 538 of the
30 1993 Session Laws becomes effective except that Sections 6, 11, and 12 of this act shall
31 not become effective if Senate Bill 2 of the 1994 Extra Session is ratified. This act
32 applies to offenses occurring on or after the effective date of this act. Prosecutions for
33 offenses committed before the effective date of this act are not abated or affected by this
34 act, and the statutes that would be applicable but for this act remain applicable to those
35 prosecutions.
