

1 Group Two – four trustees, elected by the board of commissioners of the county in
2 which the institution is located. Provided, however, if the administrative area of the
3 institution is composed of two or more counties, the trustees shall be elected jointly by
4 the boards of commissioners of all those counties, each board having one vote in the
5 election of each trustee. Provided, also, the county commissioners of the county in which
6 the community college has established a satellite campus may elect an additional two
7 members if the board of trustees of the community college agrees. Provided also, if a
8 community college serves two or more counties outside of its administrative area, the
9 board of trustees of that community college may authorize the county commissioners of
10 one or more of those counties to elect an additional board member. No more than one
11 trustee from Group Two may be a member of a board of county commissioners. Should
12 the boards of education or the boards of commissioners involved be unable to agree on
13 one or more trustees the senior resident superior court judge in the superior court district
14 or set of districts as defined in G.S. 7A-41.1 where the institution is located shall fill the
15 position or positions by appointment.

16 Group Three – four trustees, appointed by the Governor.

17 Group Four – the president of the student government or the chairman of the
18 executive board of the student body of each community college established pursuant to
19 G.S. 115D shall be an ex officio nonvoting member of the board of trustees of each said
20 institution."

21 Sec. 2. This act applies only to the College of the Albemarle.
