A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THAT THE STATE APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO LOCAL  
2 GOVERNMENTS TO COVER THE INCREASED COST IN SALARY-RELATED  
3 ITEMS FOR EMPLOYEES IN LOCALLY OPERATED STATE-FUNDED  
4 PROGRAMS.  
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6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. G.S. 143-10.1A reads as rewritten:

8 "**§ 143-10.1A. Same – Continuation and expansion costs.**

9 (a) Effective July 1, 1991, the Office of State Budget and Management and the  
10 Director of the Budget, with the advice of the Advisory Budget Commission, shall  
11 prepare the State budget in a format that adequately and fairly reflects the continuation  
12 costs for the State's share of locally operated programs established by statute or State  
13 appropriation. These continuation costs shall be computed using the same budget  
14 preparation guidelines and rules prepared by the Office of State Budget and Management  
15 for use in State agency and institution budgets. Furthermore, in the projections for the  
16 expansion costs related to employee compensation, the budget shall include the  
17 expansion costs necessary to cover the State's share of salary and salary-related items for  
18 employees in locally operated State-funded programs. Local governments or  
19 organizations spending State funds to operate local programs shall provide necessary

1 information to the Office of State Budget and Management to establish the necessary  
2 continuation and expansion costs.

3 (b) Based on the projections prepared in accordance with subsection (a) of this  
4 section, the General Assembly shall appropriate funds to local governments or  
5 organizations spending State funds to operate local programs sufficient to cover the  
6 expansion costs related to the State share of employee compensation for employees in  
7 locally operated State-funded programs."

8 Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1996.
