2	AN ACT TO	REQUEST THE SUPREME COURT TO ADOPT A PLAN TO
3	ADMINISTER JUSTICE WITHOUT DELAY IN NORTH CAROLINA TRIAL

5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:	
6	Section 1. The North Carolina Supreme Court is requested to develop and	
7	implement a case flow management plan designed to avoid delay and unnecessary	
8	appearances and to increase efficiency in the handling of cases in North Carolina's trial	
9	courts. The plan should:	
10	(1)	Place responsibility for managing the flow of cases on specific persons;
11	(2)	Adopt case processing standards and goals;
12	(3)	Address the problem of delay;
13	(4)	Avoid unnecessary appearances in court by parties, witnesses, and
14		attorneys;
15	(5)	Provide mechanisms for keeping continuous control of cases;
16	(6)	Have short-set deadlines throughout the process;
17	(7)	Include a limited continuance policy;
18	(8)	Consider the interests of victims and witnesses;
19	(9)	Set out accountability mechanisms; and

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Provide for training of those persons responsible for managing the case 1 (10)2 flow. 3 Sec. 2. The Supreme Court is requested to make a report detailing the case flow management plan to the 1995 General Assembly, Regular Session 1996, by January 4 5 1, 1996. The report should include the recommended standards and goals; a report of the 6 plan to implement those standards and goals; a timetable for implementation; persons responsible for managing the flow of cases and how they will be held accountable; how 7 the plan is going to be evaluated; what training is necessary; and recommended 8 legislation to facilitate implementation. 9

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Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.

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
