AN ACT TO SIMPLIFY THE LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN

AN ACT TO SIMPLIFY THE LICENSING REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTAIN PESTICIDE APPLICATORS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

 Section 1. G.S. 106-65.25(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) A license is not required for any person (or his full-time regular employees) doing structural pest control work on his own property: provided, however, that no fee may shall be charged for structural pest control work performed by any such person. A person who is licensed as a pesticide applicator under Part 4 of Article 52 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes in any classification that permits the application of pesticides for control of household pests in outside areas may apply those pesticides in outside areas without being licensed under this Article, provided that person complies with the provisions regarding financial responsibility under G.S. 106-65.37."

Sec. 2. This act is effective upon ratification.
