## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO PROVIDE FOR A MODEL CLINICAL 2 3
  - TEACHING NETWORK IN EASTERN NORTH CAROLINA.

Whereas, there is growing recognition for the need to strengthen pre-service teacher preparation; and

Whereas, the Model Clinical Teaching Program (MCTP) at East Carolina University has received three national awards and further recognition by State and regional professional organizations for its clinical field-based approach to elementary teacher preparation; and Whereas, graduates of the MCTP have achieved continuing success and are remaining in the profession at levels thirty to forty percent higher than State or national teacher retention rates; and

Whereas, East Carolina University is the largest producer of teachers in North Carolina; Now, therefore,

- 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
- Section 1. (a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Board of 5 Governors of The University of North Carolina the sum of three hundred eighty-five 6
- thousand dollars (\$385,000) for the 1995-96 fiscal year to expand the successful Model 7
- Clinical Teaching Program to include all elementary, middle grades, secondary, and 8
- special education teacher preparation programs at East Carolina University. These funds 9

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shall support joint training of teachers and university faculty and operating costs to 1 implement a year-long pre-service student internship in competitively selected clinical 2 3 schools in a 17-county Model Clinical Teaching Network in Eastern North Carolina. 4 The East Carolina University School of Education and the Eastern North (b)5 Carolina Model Clinical Teaching Network shall submit an annual evaluation report to (i) 6 the Chairs of the Senate and House of Representatives Education Committees and (ii) the Chairs of the Senate and House of Representatives Appropriations Education 7 8 Subcommittees concerning the employment and retention rates of graduates, employers' 9 comments, and external evaluation reports. The evaluation data will assist members of

the General Assembly in their efforts to achieve measurable improvements in public

11 school performance.

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Sec. 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1995.
