2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE ROLE OF THE WILDLIFE RESOURCES
3	COMMISSION IN THE PROTECTION OF ENDANGERED AND THREATENED
4	WILD ANIMAL SPECIES AND WILD ANIMAL SPECIES OF SPECIAL
5	CONCERN.
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	Section 1. G.S. 113-333 reads as rewritten:
8	"§ 113-333. Powers and duties of the Commission.
9	(a) In the administration of this Article, the Wildlife Resources Commission shall
10	have the following powers and duties:
11	(1) To adopt and publish an endangered species list, a threatened species
12	list, and a list of species of special concern, as provided for in G.S. 113-
13	334, identifying each entry by its scientific and common name; name.
14	(2) To reconsider and revise the lists from time to time in response to public
15	proposals or as the Commission deems necessary; necessary.

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1	(3) To coordinate development and implementation of conservation
2	programs <u>and plans</u> for endangered and threatened species of wild
2	animals and for species of special concern; concern.
4	(4) To adopt regulations necessary to and implement conservation programs
4 5	for endangered, threatened, and special concern species and to limit,
6	regulate, or prevent the taking, collection, or sale of protected animals;
7	animals.
8	(5) To conduct investigations to determine whether a wild animal should be
9	on a protected animal list and to determine the requirements for survival
10	of resident conservation of protected wild animal species.
11	(b) Using the procedures set out in Article 2A of Chapter 150B of the General
12	Statutes, the Wildlife Resources Commission shall develop a conservation plan for the
13	recovery of protected wild animal species. In developing a conservation plan for a
14	protected wild animal species, the Wildlife Resources Commission shall consider the
15	range of conservation, protection, and management measures that may be applied to
16	benefit the species and its habitat. The conservation plan shall include a comprehensive
17	analysis of all factors that have been identified as causing the decline of the protected
18	wild animal species and all measures that could be taken to restore the species. The
19	analysis shall consider the costs of measures to protect and restore the species and the
20	impact of those measures on the local economy, units of local government, and the use
21	and development of private property. The analysis shall consider reasonably available
22	options for minimizing the costs and adverse economic impacts of measures to protect
23	and restore the species.
24	(c) In implementing a conservation plan under this Article, the Wildlife Resources
25	Commission shall not adopt any rule that restricts the use or development of private
26	property. If a conservation plan identifies a conservation, protection, or restoration
27	measure the implementation of which is beyond the scope of the authority of the Wildlife
28	Resources Commission, the Commission may petition the General Assembly, any agency
29	that has regulatory authority to implement the measure, a unit of local government, or any
30	other public or private entity and request the assistance of that agency or entity in
31	implementing the measure."
