AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT A FORMER GOVERNOR OF THE STATE WHO HAS SERVED AS A MEMBER OF THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA BOARD OF GOVERNORS SHALL BE A MEMBER EMERITUS OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS AND TO PROHIBIT THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS FROM ELECTING A CHAIRMAN BETWEEN THE TIME THAT THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY ELECTS MEMBERS AND THOSE MEMBERS TAKE OFFICE.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 116-6(g) reads as rewritten:

"(g) Effective July 1, 1991, and thereafter, any person who has served at least one term—as a member of the Board of Governors after having served as Governor of North Carolina shall be a member emeritus of the Board of Governors, with all the rights and privileges of membership as in G.S. 116-6(f)."

Sec. 2. G.S. 116-8 reads as rewritten:

"§ 116-8. Chairman, vice-chairman and secretary.

The Board of Governors shall elect from its membership for two-year terms, and until their successors have been elected and qualified, a chairman, a vice-chairman and a secretary. Notwithstanding the previous sentence, if a vacancy occurs in the office of chairman between the time that the second house elects members of the Board of

- Governors under G.S. 116-6 and the time they are to take office under G.S. 116-5, the
- 2 Board of Governors may not elect a chairman during that period, the vice-chairman shall
- 3 act as chairman, and if there is neither a chairman nor a vice-chairman, the Board of
- 4 Governors may elect one of its members chairman pro tempore. No person may serve as
- 5 chairman more than four years in succession."
- 6 Sec. 3. This act is effective upon ratification.
