| 9  | school personnel, every additional hour scheduled may be used to offset one hour of a       |
| 10 | school day lost due to inclement weather.   |
| 11 | Sec. 2. A local board of education may schedule longer school days under                    |
| 12 | Section 1 of this act only after all extra calendar days required under G.S. 115C-84(c)     |
| 13 | have been scheduled to be used as instructional days. A local board of education            |
| 14 | proceeding under Section 1 of this act may not excuse students from attendance under        |
| 15 | G.S. 115C-84(c).  |
| 16 | Sec. 3. This act applies only to the Alleghany County and Stokes County                     |
| 17 | School Administrative Units. The Alleghany County and Stokes County Boards of               |
| 18 | Education shall evaluate the educational effectiveness of this type of scheduling and shall |

- 1 report the results of this evaluation to the State Board of Education for the first two years
- 2 following the ratification of this act.
- 3 Sec. 4. This act is effective upon ratification and applies to school years 4 beginning with the 1996-97 school year.
