A JOINT RESOLUTION HONORING THE LIFE AND MEMORY OF SENATOR 1 2 JOHN BONNELL CODINGTON, MD. Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington was born in Wilmington, North 3 4 Carolina on October 27, 1925, to Herbert A. Codington and Jessie Peck Codington; and Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington graduated from Davidson College in 5 1949, and from the University of Maryland School of Medicine in 1953; and 6 Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington spent most of his life in his native 7 Wilmington and contributed greatly to the quality of its life; and 8 Whereas, until his retirement in 1990, Dr. John Bonnell Codington practiced 9 general surgery for 32 years at James Walker, New Hanover, and Cape Fear Memorial 10 hospitals; and 11 Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington was active throughout his life in civic 12 and community affairs, serving as a member of the New Hanover County Board of 13 Education, as a member of the Board of Trustees of the University of North Carolina at 14 Wilmington, and as a member of the Board of Trustees of Champion McDowell Davis 15 Charitable Foundation: and 16

2	1993, where he served on several committees including the Appropriations
3	Subcommittee on General Government, Children and Human Resources, Insurance,
4	Judiciary I, and Ways and Means; and
5	Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington was a veteran of World War II, serving
6	his country from 1943 to 1946; and
7	Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington was awarded the Civil Rights Award
8	in 1983, and was honored as Professor of the Year in 1985; and
9	Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington was a life-long member of the First
10	Presbyterian Church, where he served as ruling elder; and
11	Whereas, for more than 15 years, Dr. John Bonnell Codington gave freely of
12	his time and energy as a medical missionary in Leogane, Haiti, treating the sick and
13	teaching surgical techniques to local doctors; and
14	Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington, citizen of North Carolina, died on
15	March 1, 1994, bringing to an end his meaningful and illustrative life; and
16	Whereas, Dr. John Bonnell Codington is survived by his wife, Elizabeth
17	Carter Codington; his daughters, Elizabeth Codington Reid and Anne Codington
18	Autrey; his son, John Bonnell Codington, Jr.; and five grandchildren; and
19	Whereas, it is the desire of the General Assembly to duly recognize Dr. John
20	Bonnell Codington's service and pay tribute to his life;
21	Now, therefore, be it resolved by the Senate, the House of Representatives concurring:
22	Section 1. The General Assembly honors the memory of Dr. John Bonnell
