1 2	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR A HORSE PROMOTION ASSESSMENT.
3	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
4	Section 1. Chapter 106 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new
5	Article to read:

7	"HORSE INDUSTRY PROMOTION ACT.

9	This Article may be cited as the Horse Industry Promotion Act.
10	" <u>§ 106-821. Findings.</u>
11	The General Assembly finds that the horse industry makes an important contribution
12	to the State's economy and that it is appropriate for the State to provide a means for horse
13	owners to voluntarily assess themselves in order to provide funds to promote the interests
14	of the horse industry.
15	" <u>§ 106-822. Definitions.</u>
16	As used in this Article:
17	(1) <u>'Commercial horse feed' means any commercial feed, as defined in G.S.</u>
18	106-284.33, labeled for equine use.

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1	<u>(2)</u>	'Council' means the North Carolina Horse Council.
2	<u>(3)</u>	'Department' means the Department of Agriculture and Consumer

4	<u>(4)</u>	'Equine' means a horse, pony, mule, donkey, or hinny.

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1	(a) The Department shall remit all funds collected under this Article to the Council			
2	at least quarterly. The Council shall use these funds to promote the interests of the horse			
3	industry and may use these funds for those administrative expenses that are reasonably			
4	necessary to carry out this function.			
5	(b) Any person who purchases commercial horse feed upon which the assessment			
6	has been paid has the right to refuse in writing to pay the assessment. The seller shall			
7	reduce the price accordingly and may seek a refund of the refused assessment by making			
8	demand in writing to the Council within 30 days of purchase of the feed. This demand			
9	shall be accompanied by proof of refusal satisfactory to the Council."			
10	Section 2. G.S. 106-550 reads as rewritten:			
11	"§ 106-550. Policy as to promotion of use of, and markets for, farm products.			
12	It is declared to be in the interest of the public welfare that the North Carolina farmers			
13	who are producers of livestock, poultry, field crops and other agricultural products,			
14	including cattle, sheep, broilers, turkeys, commercial eggs, peanuts, cotton, potatoes,			
15	sweet potatoes, peaches, apples, berries, vegetables and other fruits of all kinds, as well			
16	as bulbs and flowers and other agricultural products having a domestic or foreign market,			
17	shall be permitted and encouraged to act jointly and in cooperation with growers,			
18	handlers, dealers and processors of such products in promoting and stimulating, by			
19	advertising and other methods, the increased production, use and sale, domestic and			
20	foreign, of any and all of such agricultural commodities. The provisions of this Article,			
21	however, shall not include the agricultural products of tobacco, strawberries, strawberry			
22	plants, or-porcine animals, or horses, with respect to which separate provisions have been			
23	made."			
24	Section 3. This act is effective when it becomes law.
