February 17, 1997 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO REQUIRE ALL WASTEWATER SYSTEMS THAT MUST BE PERMITTED TO DISCHARGE WASTE TO HAVE AN ON-SITE GENERATOR, TO MAKE THIS REQUIREMENT A CONDITION OF A PERMIT, AND TO AUTHORIZE GRANTS FROM THE CLEAN WATER MANAGEMENT TRUST FUND TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS FOR A PORTION OF THE COST OF REQUIREMENT, AS RECOMMENDED SATISFYING THIS BYTHE ENVIRONMENTAL REVIEW COMMISSION. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 143-215.1(b) is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: The Commission shall, as a condition of a permit, require wastewater "(5)systems, for which a permit for facilities discharging to the waters of the State is required, to have on-site a generator that is operated by a source of power other than electricity." Section 2. G.S. 143-215.1 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: "(h) Any wastewater system for which a permit for facilities discharging to the waters of the State is required shall not be operated unless a generator that is operated by a source of power other than electricity is maintained on-site."

Section 3. By October 1, 1997, the Environmental Management Commission

shall develop a schedule of dates after October 1, 1997, but not to extend beyond January

1, 2003, by which existing wastewater systems with discharge permits must comply with G.S. 143-215.1(b)(5) and G.S. 143-215.1(h), as enacted in Sections 1 and 2 of this act.

Section 4. This act becomes effective October 1, 1997, and applies to those new wastewater systems and expansions of wastewater systems for which a discharge permit is required and for which a site evaluation is conducted on or after that date and applies to all other wastewater systems in accordance with the schedule developed under Section 3 of this act.
