2	AN ACT TO CHANGE THE TERM OF OFFICE OF THE CHARLOTTE-
3	MECKLENBURG BOARD OF EDUCATION FROM FOUR YEARS TO TWO
4	YEARS, SUBJECT TO A REFERENDUM.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. Section 2(a) of Chapter 167 of the 1993 Session Laws reads as
7	rewritten:
8	"(a) In 1995 and quadrennially thereafter, three members of the Charlotte-
9	Mecklenburg Board of Education shall be elected for four-year terms by all the qualified
10	voters of Mecklenburg County. In 1997 two members of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg
11	Board of Education shall be elected for two-year terms by all the qualified voters of
12	Mecklenburg County. In 1999 and biennially thereafter, five members of the Charlotte-
13	Mecklenburg Board of Education shall be elected for two-year terms by all the qualified
14	voters of Mecklenburg County."
15	Section 2. Section 2(c) of Chapter 167 of the 1993 Session Laws reads as
16	rewritten:
17	"(c) In 1995, one member of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education shall
18	be elected from each district for a two-year term by all the qualified voters of the district.
19	In 1997 and quadrennially biennially thereafter, one member of the Charlotte-

- 1 Mecklenburg Board of Education shall be elected from each district for a four-year-two-
- 2 <u>year term by all the qualified voters of the district.</u>"

Section 3. Sections 1 and 2 of this act are effective only if approved by the qualified voters of Mecklenburg County in a referendum to be held on Tuesday after the first Monday in November of 1997. The referendum shall be conducted by the Mecklenburg County Board of Elections.

7 The question on the ballot shall be:

11 Section 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
