1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO CLARIFY THAT THE SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION HAS THE
3	AUTHORITY TO SET PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS IN MATERNITY
4	HOMES, CHILD PLACING AGENCIES, AND CHILD CARE INSTITUTIONS.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. G.S. 143B-153 reads as rewritten:
7	"§ 143B-153. Social Services Commission – creation, powers and duties.
8	There is hereby created the Social Services Commission of the Department of Human
9	Resources with the power and duty to adopt rules and regulations to be followed in the
10	conduct of the State's social service programs with the power and duty to adopt, amend,
11	and rescind rules and regulations under and not inconsistent with the laws of the State
12	necessary to carry out the provisions and purposes of this Article. Provided, however, the
13	Department of Human Resources shall have the power and duty to adopt rules and
14	regulations to be followed in the conduct of the State's medical assistance program.
15	(1) The Social Services Commission is authorized and empowered to adopt
16	such rules and regulations that may be necessary and desirable for the
17	programs administered by the Department of Human Resources as
18	provided in Chapter 108A of the General Statutes of the State of North
19	Carolina.

23		d. For the inspection and operation of jails or local confinement
24		facilities as provided by G.S. 153A-220 and Article 2 of Chapter
25		131D of the General Statutes of the State of North Carolina;
26		e. Repealed by Session Laws 1981, c. 562, s. 7.
27		f. For the regulation and licensing of charitable organizations,
28		professional fund-raising counsel and professional solicitors as
29		provided by Chapter 131D of the General Statutes of the State of
30		North Carolina.
31	(4)	The Social Services Commission shall have the power and duty to
32		authorize investigations of social problems, with authority to subpoena
33		witnesses, administer oaths, and compel the production of necessary
34		documents.
35	(5)	The Social Services Commission shall have the power and duty to ratify
36		reciprocal agreements with agencies in other states that are responsible
37		for the administration of public assistance and child welfare programs to
38		provide assistance and service to the residents and nonresidents of the
39		State.
40	(6)	The Commission is authorized and empowered to adopt such rules and
41		regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of this State, as may be
42		required by the federal government of grants-in-aid for social services
43		purposes which may be made available for the State by the federal

	(7)	The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations consistent with the
4		provisions of this Chapter. All rules and regulations not inconsistent
5		with the provisions of this Chapter heretofore adopted by the Board of
6		Social Services shall remain in full force and effect unless and until
7		repealed or superseded by action of the Social Services Commission.
8		All rules and regulations adopted by the Commission shall be enforced
9		by the Department of Human Resources.
10	(8)	The Commission may establish by regulation, except for Title XX
11		services provided solely through the Division of Mental Health,
12		Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services, rates or fees
13		for:
14		a. A fee schedule for the payment of the costs of necessary day care
15		in licensed facilities and registered plans for minor children of
16		needy families.
17		b. A fee schedule for the payment by recipients for services which
18		are established in accordance with Title XX of the Social
19		Security Act and implementing regulations; and
20		c. The payment of an administrative fee not to exceed two hundred
21		dollars (\$200.00) to be paid by public or nonprofit agencies
22		which employ students under the Plan Assuring College
23		Education (PACE) program.
