1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO CLARIFY THAT THE SOCIAL SERVICES COMMISSION HAS THE AUTHORITY TO SET PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS IN MATERNITY HOMES, CHILD PLACING AGENCIES, AND CHILD CARE INSTITUTIONS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. G.S. 143B-153 reads as rewritten:

"§ 143B-153. Social Services Commission – creation, powers and duties.

There is hereby created the Social Services Commission of the Department of Human Resources with the power and duty to adopt rules and regulations to be followed in the conduct of the State's social service programs with the power and duty to adopt, amend, and rescind rules and regulations under and not inconsistent with the laws of the State necessary to carry out the provisions and purposes of this Article. Provided, however, the Department of Human Resources shall have the power and duty to adopt rules and regulations to be followed in the conduct of the State's medical assistance program.

(1) The Social Services Commission is authorized and empowered to adopt such rules and regulations that may be necessary and desirable for the programs administered by the Department of Human Resources as provided in Chapter 108A of the General Statutes of the State of North Carolina.

7		3. Contracting for and purchasing services; and

10	(3)	The Social Services Commission shall have the power and duty to

12		a. For the inspection and licensing of maternity homes as provided
13		by G.S. 131D-1; G.S. 131D-1 and for personnel requirements of
14		staff employed in maternity homes;
15		b. For the inspection and licensing of adult care homes for aged or
16		disabled persons as provided by G.S. 131D-2(b) and for
17		personnel requirements of staff employed in adult care homes

19		c. For the inspection and licensing of child-care child care
20		institutions and child placing agencies as provided by G.S. 131D-

25		d. For the inspection and operation of jails or local confinement
26		facilities as provided by G.S. 153A-220 and Article 2 of Chapter
27		131D of the General Statutes of the State of North Carolina;

29		f. For the regulation and licensing of charitable organizations,
30		professional fund-raising counsel and professional solicitors as
31		provided by Chapter 131D of the General Statutes of the State of
32	(4)	North Carolina.
33	(4)	The Social Services Commission shall have the power and duty to
34		authorize investigations of social problems, with authority to subpoena
35		witnesses, administer oaths, and compel the production of necessary
36	(5)	documents.
37	(5)	The Social Services Commission shall have the power and duty to ratify
38		reciprocal agreements with agencies in other states that are responsible
39		for the administration of public assistance and child welfare programs to
40		provide assistance and service to the residents and nonresidents of the
41		State.
42	(6)	The Commission is authorized and empowered to adopt such rules and
43		regulations, not inconsistent with the laws of this State, as may be

1	required by the federal government of grants-in-aid for social service
2	purposes which may be made available for the State by the federa
3	government. This section is to be liberally construed in order that the
4	State and its citizens may benefit from such grants-in-aid.
5 (7)	The Commission shall adopt rules and regulations consistent with the
6	provisions of this Chapter. All rules and regulations not inconsister
7	with the provisions of this Chapter heretofore adopted by the Board of
8	Social Services shall remain in full force and effect unless and unt
9	repealed or superseded by action of the Social Services Commission
10	All rules and regulations adopted by the Commission shall be enforce
11	by the Department of Human Resources.
12 (8)	The Commission may establish by regulation, except for Title XX
13	services provided solely through the Division of Mental Health
14	Developmental Disabilities, and Substance Abuse Services, rates or fee
15	for:
16	a. A fee schedule for the payment of the costs of necessary day car
17	in licensed facilities and registered plans for minor children of
18	needy families.
19	b. A fee schedule for the payment by recipients for services whic
20	are established in accordance with Title XX of the Socia
21	Security Act and implementing regulations; and
22	c. The payment of an administrative fee not to exceed two hundre
23	dollars (\$200.00) to be paid by public or nonprofit agencie
24	which employ students under the Plan Assuring College
25	Education (PACE) program.
26	d. Child support enforcement services as defined by G.S. 110
27	130.1."
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Section 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.

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
