"(4)	'Establishment that prepares or serves drink' means a business or oth entity that processes fruits and vegetables to produce juices or oth liquids for drinks, or otherwise puts together, portions, sets out, or han out drinks in unpackaged portions using containers that are reused on premises rather than single-service containers. for human consumption except for establishments that only set out or hand out drinks regulated by the North Carolina Department of Agriculture accordance with G.S. 106-120 through G.S. 106-145."  on 2. G.S. 130A-247(5) reads as rewritten:  'Establishment that prepares or serves food' means a business or oth entity that cooks, puts together, portions, sets out, or hands out food unpackaged portions for human consumption. for human consumption except for establishments that only set out or hand out food as regulated.	ner nds the on, as in

Exemptions. 5 The following shall be exempt from this Part: 6 Establishments that provide lodging described in G.S. 130A-248(a1) 7 with four or fewer lodging units; 8 (2) Condominiums: 9 (3) Establishments that prepare or serve food or provide lodging to regular 10 boarders or permanent house guests only; (4) Private homes that occasionally offer lodging accommodations, which 11 12 may include the providing of food, for two weeks or less to persons attending special events, provided these homes are not bed and breakfast 13 14 homes or bed and breakfast inns; 15 (5) Private clubs; 16 (6) Curb markets operated by the State Agricultural Extension Service; 17 (7) Establishments that prepare or serve food or drink for pay no more 18 frequently than once a month for a period not to exceed two consecutive days; days, including establishments permitted pursuant to this Part 19 20 when preparing or serving food or drink at a location other than at the 21 permitted location; Establishments that put together, portion, set out, or hand out only drinks 22 (8) 23 drinks that do not include the processing of fruits and vegetables to 24 produce juices or other liquids for drinks, using single service containers that are not reused on the premises; and 25 (9) Markets where meat food products or poultry products are prepared and 26 sold and which are under the continuous-inspection by the North Carolina 27 Department of Agriculture or the United States Department of 28 29 Agriculture. Agriculture; and 30 Establishments that process fruits and vegetables to produce juices or (10)other liquids for drinks and are under inspection by the North Carolina 31 Department of Agriculture or the United States Department of 32 Agriculture." 33 Section 4.
