2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE NORTH CAROLINA MEDICAL BOARD TO
3	LICENSE INSTEAD OF APPROVE PHYSICIAN ASSISTANTS, TO ISSUE A
4	PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT LIMITED VOLUNTEER LICENSE, AND TO MAKE
5	OTHER CHANGES IN THE STATUTES REGULATING PHYSICIAN
6	ASSISTANTS.
7	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
8	Section 1. G.S. 90-2(d) reads as rewritten:
9	"(d) Any member of the Board may be removed from office by the Governor for
10	good cause shown. Any vacancy in the physician membership of the Board shall be filled
11	for the period of the unexpired term by the Governor from a list of physicians submitted
12	by the North Carolina Medical Society Executive Council. Any vacancy in the public
13	public, physician assistant, or nurse practitioner membership of the Board shall be filled
14	by the Governor for the unexpired term."
15	Section 2. G.S. 90-11 reads as rewritten:
16	"§ 90-11. Qualifications of applicant for license.
17	Every applicant for a license to practice medicine or for approval-to perform medical
18	acts-acts, tasks, and functions as a physician assistant in the State shall satisfy the North
19	Carolina Medical Board that such-the applicant is of good moral character and meets the

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1	other qualifications for the issuance of such a license or for such approval before any such			
2	license or approval is granted by the Board to such the applicant."			
3	Section 3. Article 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Statutes is amended by			
4	adding a new section to read:			
5	" <u>§ 90-12.1. Physician assistant limited volunteer license.</u>			
6	The Board shall issue a limited volunteer license which shall authorize a physician			
7	assistant to perform medical acts, tasks, and functions without payment or other			
8	compensation if the physician assistant meets one of the following:			
9	(1) Holds a current license or registration in another state and submits proof			
10	of this status to the Board.			
11	(2) Holds a current license in this State and is not currently employed as a			
12	<u>physician assistant.</u>			
13	(3) Is a member of the United States armed services or is employed by the			
14	Veterans' Administration or another federal agency."			
15	Section 4. G.S. 90-18(13) reads as rewritten:			
16	"(13) Any act, task or function performed by an assistant to a person			
17	licensed as a physician by the North Carolina Medical Board when			
18	a. Such assistant is approved by and annually registered with the			
19	Board as one qualified by training or experience to function as an			
20	assistant to a physician, except that no more than two assistants			
21	may be currently registered for any physician, and			
22	b. Such act, task or function is performed at the direction or under			
23	the supervision of such physician, in accordance with rules and			
24	regulations promulgated by the Board, and			
25	c. The services of the assistant are limited to assisting the physician			
26	in the particular field or fields for which the assistant has been			
27	trained, approved and registered;			
28	The performance of any medical acts, tasks, and functions by a licensed			
29	physician assistant at the direction or under the supervision of a			
30	physician in accordance with rules adopted by the Board. Provided that			
31	this <u>This</u> subdivision shall not limit or prevent any physician from			
32	delegating to a qualified person any acts, tasks or tasks, and functions			
33	which-that are otherwise permitted by law or established by custom. The			
34	Board shall authorize physician assistants licensed in this State or			
35	another state to perform specific medical acts, tasks, and functions			
36	during a disaster."			
37	Section 5. G.S. 90-18.1 reads as rewritten:			
38	"§ 90-18.1. Limitations on physician assistants.			
39	(a) Any person who is approved licensed under the provisions of G.S. 90-18(13)			
40	G.S. 90-11 to perform medical acts, tasks or tasks, and functions as an assistant to a			
41	physician may use the title 'physician assistant.' assistant'. Any other person who uses the			

41 physician may use the title 'physician assistant.' assistant'. Any other person who uses the 42 title in any form or holds out to be a physician assistant or to be so approved, licensed,

43 shall be deemed to be in violation of this Article.

3	(e) Any prescription written by a physician assistant or order given by a physician
4	assistant for medications, tests-tests, or treatments shall be deemed to have been
5	authorized by the physician approved by the Board as the supervisor of the physician
6	assistant and such-the supervising physician shall be responsible for authorizing such-the
7	prescription or order.
8	(f) Any registered nurse or licensed practical nurse who receives an order from a
9	physician assistant for medications, tests tests, or treatments is authorized to perform that
10	order in the same manner as if it were received from a licensed physician."
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Section 6. This act is effective when it becomes law.
