	the person may employ a youth who is 14 or 15 years old to work on the		
	premises under the same restrictions that apply under subdivision (2) of		
	this subsection to 16 and 17 year olds who work on the premises. The		
	definitions of 'restaurant,' 'hotel,' and 'sports club' in G.S. 18B-1000		
	apply in this subdivision.		
(2)	Under 18 years of age to prepare, serve, dispense or sell any alcoholic		

beverages, including mixed beverages."
