2	AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT AN ENHANCED CRIMINAL PENALTY SHALL BE
3	IMPOSED ON A PERSON WHO POSSESSES A BULLET-PROOF VEST WHILE
4	COMMITTING A FELONY.
5	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
6	Section 1. Part 2 of Article 81B of Chapter 15A of the General Statutes is
7	amended by adding a new section to read:
8	"§ 15A-1340.16C. Enhanced sentence if defendant is convicted of a felony and the
9	defendant possessed a bullet-proof vest during the commission of the
10	<u>felony.</u>
11	(a) If a person is convicted of a felony and the court finds that the person
12	possessed a bullet-proof vest at the time of the felony, then the person is guilty of a
13	felony that is one class higher than the underlying felony for which the person was
14	convicted.
15	(b) This section does not apply if the evidence that the person possessed a bullet-
16	proof vest is needed to prove an element of the underlying felony for which the person
17	was convicted."
