1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF NORTH CAROLINA AQUARIUMS,
3	RATHER THAN THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES,
4	TO OPERATE OR CONTRACT FOR FOOD AND VENDING SERVICES AT THE
5	NORTH CAROLINA AQUARIUMS, AND TO REQUIRE THE NET PROCEEDS
6	OF THESE FOOD AND VENDING SERVICES TO BE CREDITED TO THE
7	NORTH CAROLINA AQUARIUMS FUND.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	Section 1. G.S. 111-42 reads as rewritten:
10	"§ 111-42. Definitions as used in this Article.
11	(1) 'Automatic vending' means a coin, currency, token, ticket, or credit card
12	operated machine that dispenses food, drinks, or sundries.
13	(a) (2) 'Regular vending facility' means a vending facility where food preparation
14	or cooking is not done on the State property.
15	(b) (3) 'State agency' means department, commission, agency or instrumentality of
16	the State.
17	(c) (4) 'State property or State building' means building and land owned, leased, or
18	otherwise controlled by the State, exclusive of schools, colleges and universities, the

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North Carolina State Fair, the North Carolina Aquariums, and the State Legislative 1 2 Building. 3 (5) 'Vending facility' includes a snack bar, cafeteria, restaurant, cafe, <del>(d)</del> concession stand, vending stand, cart service, or other facilities at which food, drinks, 4 5 novelties, newspapers, periodicals, confections, souvenirs, tobacco products or related 6 items are regularly sold. 7 (6) 'Visually handicapped' means a person who is totally blind or whose vision <del>(e)</del> 8 with glasses is so defective as to prevent the performance of ordinary activity for which 9 evesight is essential and who is registered pursuant to G.S. 111-4." 10 Section 2. G.S. 111-43 reads as rewritten: "§ 111-43. Installation of coin-operated-automatic vending machines. 11 12 In locations where the Department determines that a vending facility may not (a) 13 be operated or should not continue to operate due to insufficient revenues to support a 14 blind vendor or due to the lack of qualified blind applicants, the Department shall have 15 the first opportunity to secure, by negotiation of a contract with one or more licensed 16 commercial vendors, coin-operated automatic vending machines for the location. Profits 17 from coin-operated automatic vending machines secured by the Department shall be used 18 by the Department for the support of programs that enable blind people to live more independently, including medical, rehabilitation, independent living, and educational 19 20 services offered by the Division of Services for the Blind. 21 (b)Notwithstanding the provisions of G.S. 111-42(4), the North Carolina Aquariums shall not operate or secure a contract for the operation of automatic vending 22 23 machines unless the Department fails or refuses to secure a contract for automatic 24 vending machines pursuant to subsection (a) of this section." Section 3. G.S. 111-45 reads as rewritten: 25 "§ 111-45. Duty of State agency to inform Department. 26 27 It shall be the duty of the State agencies to inform the Department of existing and prospective locations for vending facilities and coin-operated-automatic vending machines 28 29 and to prescribe regulations (upon request of the Department) to promote the successful 30 operation of the vending facilities of the visually handicapped." Section 4. G.S. 111-47 reads as rewritten: 31 32 "§ 111-47. Exclusions. 33 This Article is not intended to cover food services provided by hospitals or (a) 34 residential institutions as a direct service to patients, inmates, trainees, or otherwise 35 institutionalized persons, nor to cover coin-operated vending machines located in State 36 facilities operated under the authority of G.S. 122C. 37 This Article shall not prohibit the continued use of coin-operated-automatic (b)38 vending machines currently the property of the Division of Services for the Blind of the

39 Department of Health and Human Services and now part of the vending-stand program."

40 Section 5. Part 5C of Article 7 of Chapter 143B of the General Statutes is 41 amended by adding a new section to read:

#### 42 "§ 143B-289.45. Proceeds from food and vending services.

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1	The net proceeds of revenue generated by food and vending services that are provided
2	at the North Carolina Aquariums and are operated by or whose operation is contracted for
3	by the Division of North Carolina Aquariums shall be deposited in the North Carolina
4	Aquariums Fund."
5	Section 6. This act shall not be construed to alter any contract for food and
6	vending services at the North Carolina Aquariums that is in force at the time this act
7	becomes law.
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Section 7. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
