Referred to: Education. April 12, 1999 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO AMEND THE LAW REGARDING TESTING REQUIREMENTS FOR CHARTER SCHOOLS. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. G.S. 115C-238.29F(d)(3) reads as rewritten: A charter school shall conduct the student assessments required for "(3) charter schools by the State Board of Education. administer the tests adopted by the State Board of Education under G.S. 115C-174.11 that are used to implement the School-Based Management and Accountability Program in other public schools." Section 2. G.S. 115C-238.29G(a) reads as rewritten: The State Board of Education, or a chartering entity subject to the approval of the State Board of Education, may terminate or not renew a charter upon any of the following grounds: Failure to meet the requirements for student performance contained in (1) the charter; charter or to meet the requirements for student testing contained in G.S. 115C-238.29F(d)(3). Failure to meet generally accepted standards of fiscal management; (2)
