Short Title: Longevity for ADAs and APDs.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL LONGEVITY FOR ASSISTANT DISTRICT ATTORNEYS AND ASSISTANT PUBLIC DEFENDERS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

Section 1. G.S. 7A-65(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) In lieu of merit and other increment raises paid to regular State employees, an assistant district attorney shall receive as longevity pay an amount equal to four and eight-tenths percent (4.8%) of the annual salary set forth in the Current Operations Appropriations Act payable monthly after five years of service, nine and six-tenths percent (9.6%) after 10 years of service, ~~and~~ fourteen and four-tenths percent (14.4%) after 15 years of service, and nineteen and two-tenths percent (19.2%) after 20 years of service. "Service" means service as an assistant district attorney or as a district attorney."

Section 2. G.S. 7A-467(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) In lieu of merit and other increment raises paid to regular State employees, an assistant public defender shall receive as longevity pay an amount equal to four and eight-tenths percent (4.8%) of the annual salary set forth in the Current Operations Appropriations Act payable monthly after five years of service, nine and six-tenths percent (9.6%) after 10 years of service, ~~and~~ fourteen and four-tenths percent (14.4%)

2 years of service. "Service" means service as an assistant public defender."

3 Section 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial
4 Department the sum of seventy-five thousand dollars (\$75,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal
5 year and the sum of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for the 2000-2001 fiscal
6 year to provide the additional longevity established in this act.

7 Section 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
