A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO INCREASE THE NUMBER OF PAID MEMBERS A FIRE
DEPARTMENT MAY HAVE AND REMAIN ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE GRANTS
FROM THE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT FUND AND TO INCREASE
THE NUMBER OF PAID MEMBERS A RESCUE OR RESCUE/EMS UNIT MAY
HAVE AND REMAIN ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE GRANTS FROM THE
VOLUNTEER RESCUE/EMS FUND.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. G.S. 58-87-1(b) reads as rewritten:

- 10 "(b) A fire department is eligible for a grant under this section if it meets all of the following conditions:
  - (1) It serves a response area of 6,000 or less in population.
  - (2) It has no more than two—10 paid members and otherwise consists of volunteer members.
  - (3) It has been certified by the Department of Insurance.
- In making the population determination under subdivision (1), the Department shall use the most recent annual population estimates certified by the State Planning Officer."
  - Section 2. G.S. 58-87-5(b) reads as rewritten:

1	"(b) A rescue or rescue/EMS unit is eligible for a grant under this section if it meets
2	all of the following conditions:
3	(1) Repealed by Session Laws 1989 (Regular Session, 1990), c. 1066, s.
4	33(a).
5	(2) It has no more than two-10 paid members and otherwise consists of
6	volunteer members.
7	(3) It has been recognized by the Department as an organization that
8	provides rescue or rescue and emergency medical services.
9	(4) It satisfies the eligibility criteria established by the Department under
10	subsection (a) of this section."
11	Section 3. This act becomes effective October 1, 1999.
