2	AN ACT ALLOWING COUNTIES TO PROVIDE AFFORDABLE HOUSING FOR
3	PERSONS OF LOW AND MODERATE INCOME.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. The General Assembly finds and declares that the purpose of this
6	act is to provide authority for counties in North Carolina to provide funds for residential
7	housing construction, new or rehabilitated, and to provide for the sale or rental of housing
8	to persons and families of low and moderate income. The General Assembly finds and
9	declares that there exists in counties in the State a serious shortage of decent, safe, and
10	sanitary residential housing available at low prices or rentals to persons and families of
11	low and moderate income. This shortage is inimical to the health, safety, welfare, and
12	prosperity of all residents of the State and to the sound growth of North Carolina
13	communities.
14	Section 2. Part 5 of Article 18 of Chapter 153A of the General Statutes is
15	amended by adding a new section to read:
16	"§ 153A-378. Low- and moderate-income housing programs.
17	In addition to the powers granted by G.S. 153A-376 and G.S. 153A-377, any county

11			affordable housing to persons of low or moderate income. The county

8		financial assistance to such persons. A housing project may provide
9		housing for persons of other than low or moderate income if at least
10		forty percent (40%) of the units in the project are exclusively reserved
11		for persons of low or moderate income. No rent subsidy may be paid
12		from bond proceeds."
